

## \$300,000 Loot Taken in Train Robbery Toronto by Six Armed Bandits

Carried off Mail Sacks From Canadian National Express at Union Station About Midnight

ORONTO, June 20.—One of the largest and most daring train robberies of recent years took place last night here when six armed robbers held up the Canadian National Express car at Union Station at midnight and made their escape after seizing three registered mail bags containing, it is estimated, between thirty and forty thousand dollars.

The bandits with the booty fled in a westerly direction hotly pursued by the police but no arrest was made.

It was later reported that the loot may reach \$100,000.

## Mayor Taylor on Stand in His Own Defence at Vancouver Yesterday
