MATCHING OF TOMMY FIELDING, CANADIAN LIGHTWEIGHT AS-PIRANT, AND PERCY LAKE OF H.M.S. DURBAN, MOOTED

Ben Self is in receipt of a telegram from Joe Bailey of Victoria, formerly light weight champion of Canada and now 'identified with the Victoria Boxing Commission, stating that, if suitable arrangements can be made, it may be possible to match Tommy Fielding. prominent Victoria boxer and reputed aspirant for the Canadian lightweight title, with Percy Lake, champion lightweight boxer of the China station who will be here next month with H.M.S. Durban, in Prince Rupert during the warship's visit. Mr. Self is taking the matter up with the local unit of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve and it is possible that one of the most interesting boxing bouts here in years may ensue.
