ANOTHER SCIENTIST SAYS AGE OF METHUSELAH WAS AGE OF TRIBE, NOT MAN

DUCTLESS GLANDS

FOUNDATION OF MEDICINE TO BE LATE ANEW PREDICTS UNIVER-SITY PROFESSOR

PHILADELPHIA, May 9 -- Astronomers have got our universe-the galaxy in which man is so minute a speck-fairly well centred, and now place its central points in the milky way at a distance of about 52,000 light years from the sun, Dr. Harlow Shapley, director of the Harvard University observatory, reported to the American Philosophical Society recently. For several years the observatory has been studying a region that embraces about 95 per cent of the galaxy, or about one-fifteenth of the sky, feeling out the star clouds with as many tools as possible in search of the centre. Not only has that point been approximated, but the pole of our galaxy has been fairly well determined Dr. Shapley said, while its shape may be concave instead of flat. He estimated that the diameter of the galaxy is 200,000 light years.

AGES OF ANTEDILUVIANS Dr. Robert P. Field, of Philadelphia, in a paper on the ages of the Antediluvian Patriarches mentioned in Genesis, suggested these writing contained not only the histories of individuals but of tribes bearing their names. "The names from Adam to Terah," he said, "with their unnaturally long 'ages,' are perfectly understandable as clans, tribes, etc. Thus the clan of Adam lived 930 years, that of Seth 912 years, while they these ages." Dr. Field found that Adam flourished at about 15,000 to 20,000 B "instead of the traditional 4004 B.C."

DUCTLESS GLANDS The conclusion that the ductless glands of the body constitute the mechanism through which the life process itself is sustained, and by means of which it is protected against disease and death, was advanced by Dr. Charles E. de M. Sajous, professor at the University of Pennsylvania graduate medical school. Forty years o medical research have convinced him that these glands are really the foundation of the most vital system of the body, that of tissue respiration, or the distribution of oxygen to all the cells. The heat energy which they liberate has for its purpose, he said, the acceleration of chemical ferments which are the direct factor in sustaining cellular metabolism and tissue life.

"Knowledge of the ductless glands." he predicted, "is going to lay a new foundation for medicine."

TO TRY BISHOP

METHODISTS WILL SELECT COURT TO SIT IN JUDGMENT ON ONE OF OWN LEADERS

KANSAS CITY, May 9. - For the first time in history, a bishop will be tried by a tribunal of the Methodist Episcopal church.

When the quadrennial general con ference, the law-making body of the Church, meets here in May, it will select a court of 17 ministers to sit in judgment on Bishop Anton Bast of Copenhagen, who already has served a prison sentence following conviction in the civil courts of Denmark for mis-

appropriating charity funds. Bast, now under suspension from his office, has protested his innocence of misusing money entrusted to him, and an investigating committee headed by Bishop Thomas Nicholson of Detroit has refused to sustain the charges. But the committee brought about this temporary suspension for "imprudent and unministerial conduct."

At the civil trial in Denmark, there was testimony concerning his relations with Mrs. Ellen Vedel, the wife of a government official, and about a yacht owned by Him and Mrs. Vedel, and also about his personal expenditures totaling \$200.000 in eleven years.

BOSTON, May 9 .- Scarcity of rabbits and mice in the northern regions during the past two winters is indirectly responsible for a very considerable decrease in the number of game birds in New England and other sections of the North American continent, according to Dr. Edward Howe Forbush, director of th estate department of orhithology.
