### Supreme Court Decides Any Eritish Subject Has Right to License for Salmon Fishing but Foreigners Not

TTAWA, May 28.—The Supreme Court of Canada, in giving judgment today, was divided on the question of the discretionary power of the minister of fisheries to grant or refuse a license to fish in British Columbia. The majority decided that any British subject resident in British Columbia who was not otherwise disqualified has the right to receive a license if he submits the proper application and tenders the prescribed

Non-British subjects resident in the province are not eligible to receive a license to operate a herring or pilchard drag seine or purse seine or to take salmon or crabs or in the salmon fishing to act as boat pullers or be otherwise employed in a boat used in drifting or as helper or in any other particular capacity in operating purse seine or drag seine that is being used in fishing or to fish for salmon for commercial purposes or by means of trolling. None of these licenses can be granted to any person unless he is a British subject resident in the province or has served in the Canadian army or navy.

. The minority of the court were of opinion that the minister has discretionary authority to grant or refuse licenses to British subjects resident in the province or to returned soldiers. Justices Anglin, Newcombe, Rinfre and Lamont constituted the majority with Justices Duff, Mignault and Smith the minority.

## S.O.S. Calls Sent Out By the Dirigible Italia From Arctic Regions

Airship Supposed to be to North of Siberia When she Kept up Persistent Requests for Help Early Sunday Morning

AN FRANCISCO, May 28—Calls for help for General Nobile's dirigible Italia, in peril somewhere in Arctic waters, was picked out of the air by Pacific Coast radio operators early Sunday.

The S.O.S. calls were repeated in Italian, French and English and were persistent for two hours.

The calls were believed to indicate that the dirigible

vas somewhere north of Siberia. The Italia, commanded by General Nobile, left King's Bay, Spitzbergen early last Wednesday morning and was reported to have reached the North Pole and to have started back for the base. Later she was reported to be fighting fog and wind not far from her base and the Norwegian government was asked by the Italian government to send out a ship to search for her. Sufficient food to

NEW YORK, May 28.—The fate of the Italia is still a mystery today as rescue efforts are being pushed in Norway and Sweden. Lieut. Luetzow Holtm, the Norwegian ace, started for Spitzbergen from Oslo to carry on air search along the north and northeast coast of the archipelago.

The Norwegian authorities are preparing an auxiliary relief expedition on a large scale. The base ship Citta di Milano put out from King's Bay yesterday but was held up by the ice.

Messages picked up on the Pacific coast yesterday broadcast from Vladivostok reported the Italia down and asking assistance but nothing further today.
