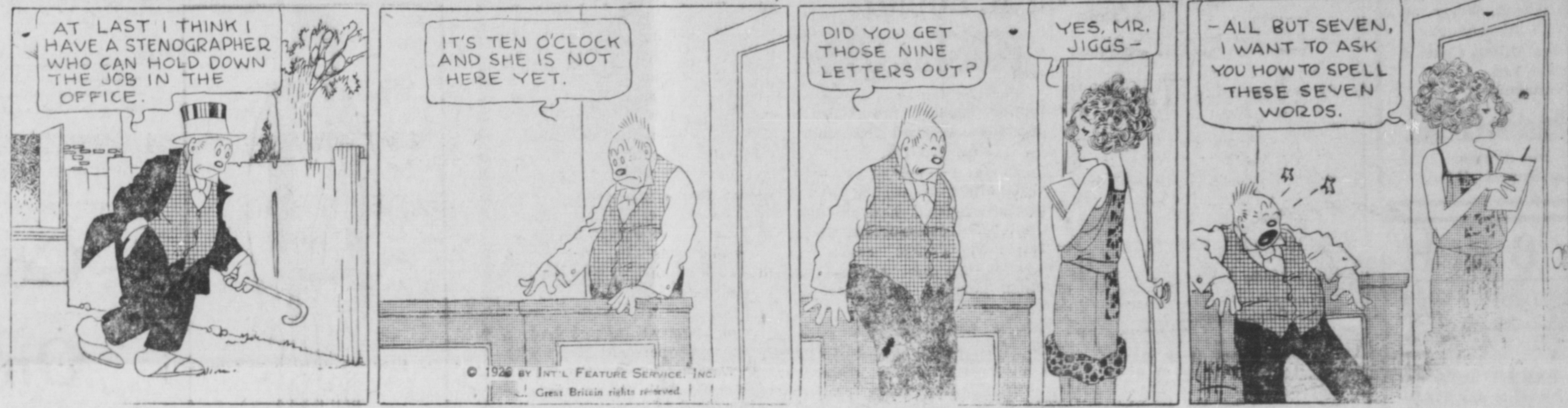
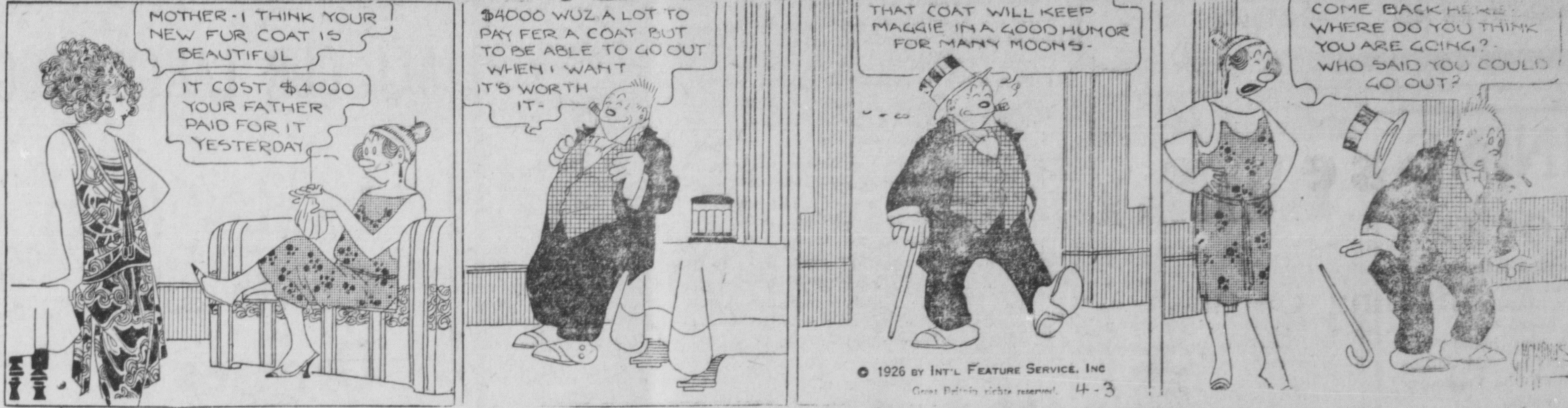

PROVINCIAL SECRETARY OF BOY SCOUTS WAS HEARD LAST EVENING

He stressed that all troops must live, move, and have their being in the patrol system which divided the troop into groups of six to eight boys under a leader.
