Marciano Wins Prized Memorial Award

NEW YORK (CP)—Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano has been named winner of the Edward J. Neil memorial plaque, awarded annually by the Boxing Writers Association to the fighter of the year.

Marciano succeeds Jersey Joe Walcott as winner of the plaque, named for the former Associated Press boxing writer who was killed in 1937 while serving as war correspondent in Spain.

New Prizes Announced For Bisley

LONDON (CP)—Canadian marksmen chosen to represent their country on next year's Bisley team will qualify to compete for a brand new prize when firing starts over the famous ranges on July 8.

The special event, open to riflemen from every part of the Commonwealth, will be known as the Coronation aggregate competition, with prizes for the 200 top scorers.

First prize will be a silver gilt Coronation medal and a monetary award of £25. The runner-up will get a silver medal and £15, while a bronze medal and £10 goes to the third best score. For other competitors there will be 97 additional bronze Coronation medals plus cash prizes graded from £5 to £1 as well as 100 consolation awards of £1 only.

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Recount Shows Tie Game Or Victory for Millers

A double-barrel upset exploded last night amid utter confusion following the senior "B" basketball game between Gordon & Anderson and CCC pulp millers.

The best referees Ole Slatta and Vern Ciccone could do was to say the game ended in a 50-50 tie, but Millers may even have won 52-50.

That was after the hardware squad players hugged each other and their coach to celebrate their one-point win, 50-49, over the millers—or so they thought for that's how the score board showed.

After the cheering and crowd cleared, the pulp mill squad's coach Helge Holkestad called for the score sheet. He and several players had been protesting a sudden change in scores on the electronic board in the last few minutes of the game when G-As were given two extra points.

But their protests were overruled by the firm voice of the score keeper.

A recount of the scores by referees showed definitely a tie game, if not a 52-50 victory for the millers, which would have been their first over the league-leading hardware.

The case will go for jurisdiction to the executive council of Basketball Association.

The game was one of the closest, most hard-fought battles on the court in recent years.

ERRORS COSTLY

see deep and dangerous possible pitfalls. He said:

"Every prisoner has the right, on the conclusion of an armistice, to be released."

"Every prisoner of war has the right to be repatriated."

"It is the duty of the detaining side to provide facilities for such repatriation."

"The detaining side has no right to use force in connection with the disposal of prisoners-of-war."

HAD WE APPLIED those principles after World War Two we would have been compelled to release and keep in Canada tens of thousands of Germans.

I wrote in this column about 1947 of the ridiculous chase by the RCMP of one lone German prisoner of war who "hid out" in Canada. He was a good salesman, a good tennis instructor, finally a good farm hand on Lulu Island. But the RCMP got their man and back he went to Germany.

Under Mr. Eden's revised principles scores of thousands like him could have stayed in Canada for life. If we do have that World War Three (which God forbid), suppose we capture a hundred thousand Chinese Reds or Soviet Communists. Are we now sure that we want to give them the right to stay here, permanently, if they so choose?

I KNOW that if World War Three comes, your son and my son may be shot down in planes, or taken prisoner in ground battle. I do not want anybody dear to me to be "processed" by the Russians or Chinese to try to convert him to stay in Russia or China of his "free will." One fellow who has been so processed called me up and said, "After 48 hours of that anybody will say anything the processors want him to say."

Nor do I want anybody I know "screened" under the circumstances of a Kojima Island.

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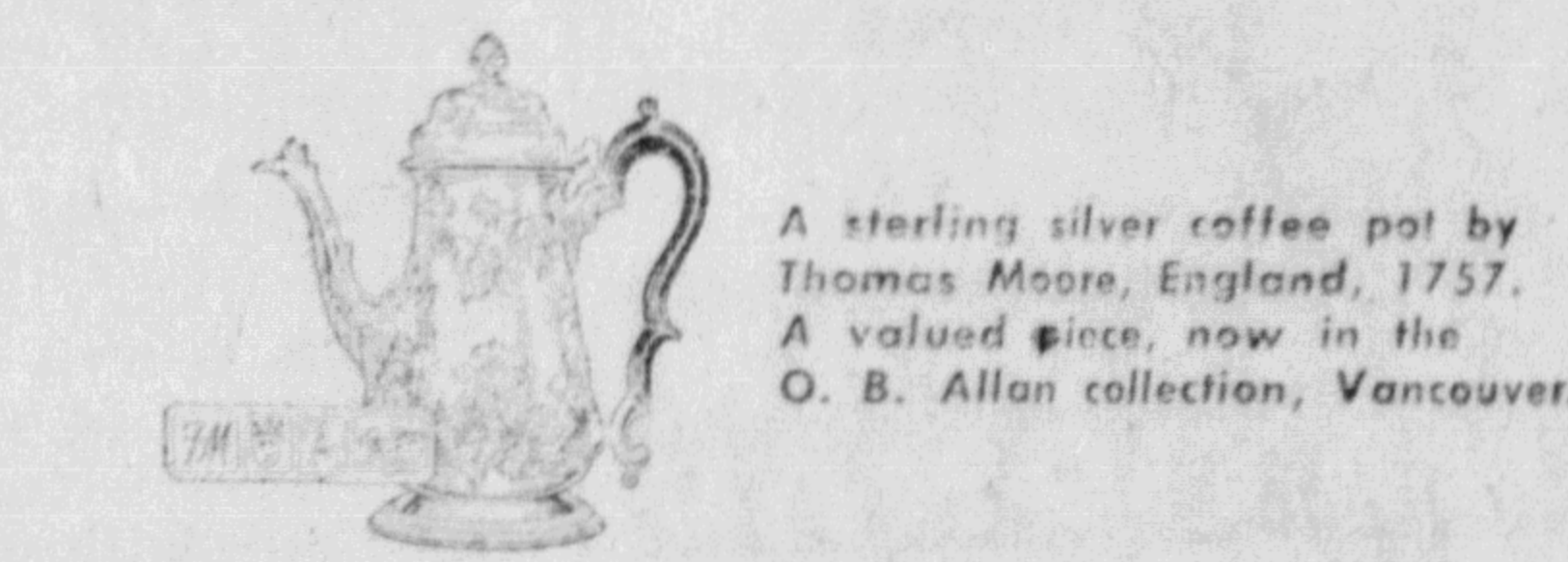
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
