the foreign resident and annoyance to the Canadian. Efforts are made to teach English to some of these, but it is a matter for the new arrival to take up. Sometimes a man will be able to speak English but his wife speaks the home language. That means that the husband never really learns English well because he speaks the other at home. To learn a language it is necessary to speak it a good deal of the time, preferably all the time.

We suggest, then, to newcomers who do not speak English or who speak it only indifferently, that they speak it in their homes and teach their children to do the same. A great many do this already but others do not.
