## Laurry Aurie, One Time Detroit Hockey Star, Dies

DETROIT — One time hockey star Laurry Aurie, pint-sized guy with a big fighting heart, died Friday.

The former Detroit Red Wing forward died after suffering a stroke at the wheel of his car Thursday night. He was 47 years old.

Aurie, a midget in comparison to some of the rink aces of his year, played on the Detroit National Hockey League championship teams of 1936 and 1937.

He was on the right wing of the sensational power line of Aurie, Marty Barry and Herbie Lewis and was the terror of the league despite his weight, which ranged only from 139 to 145 pounds.

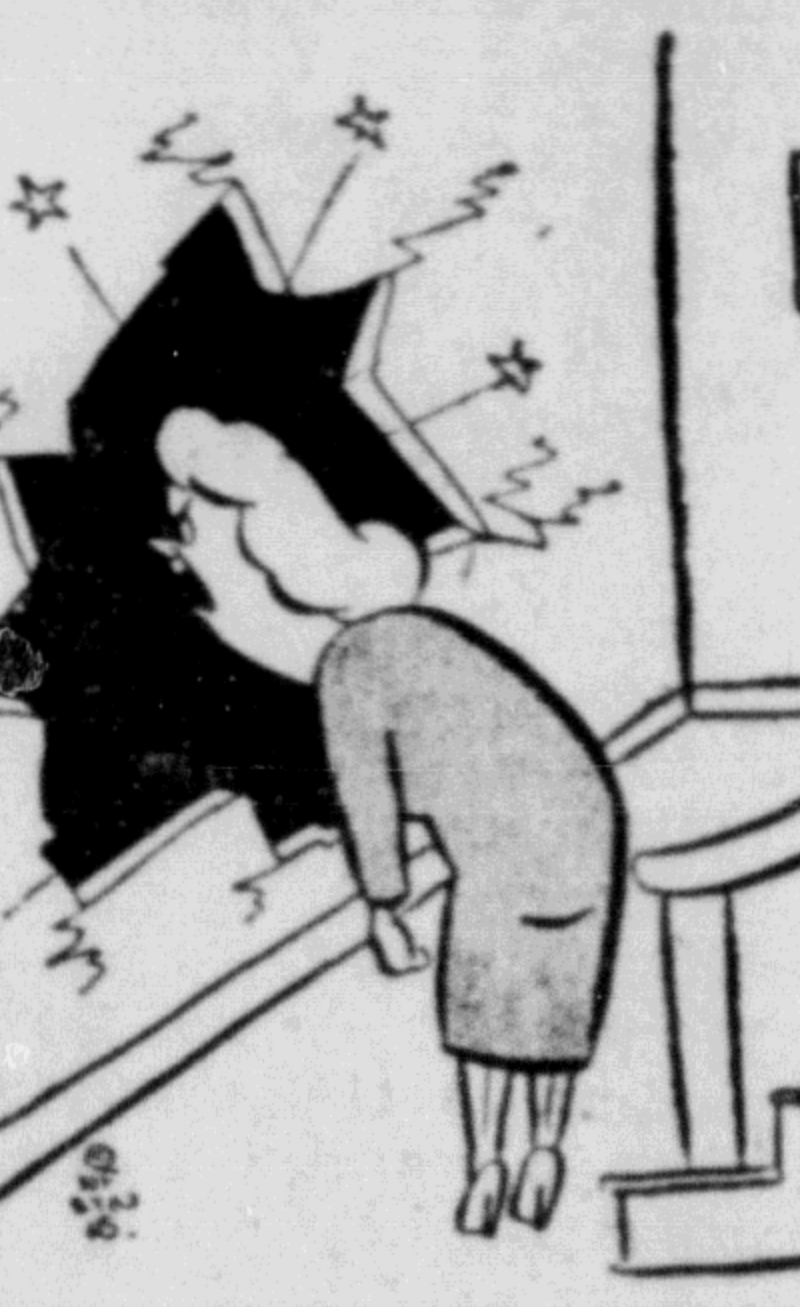

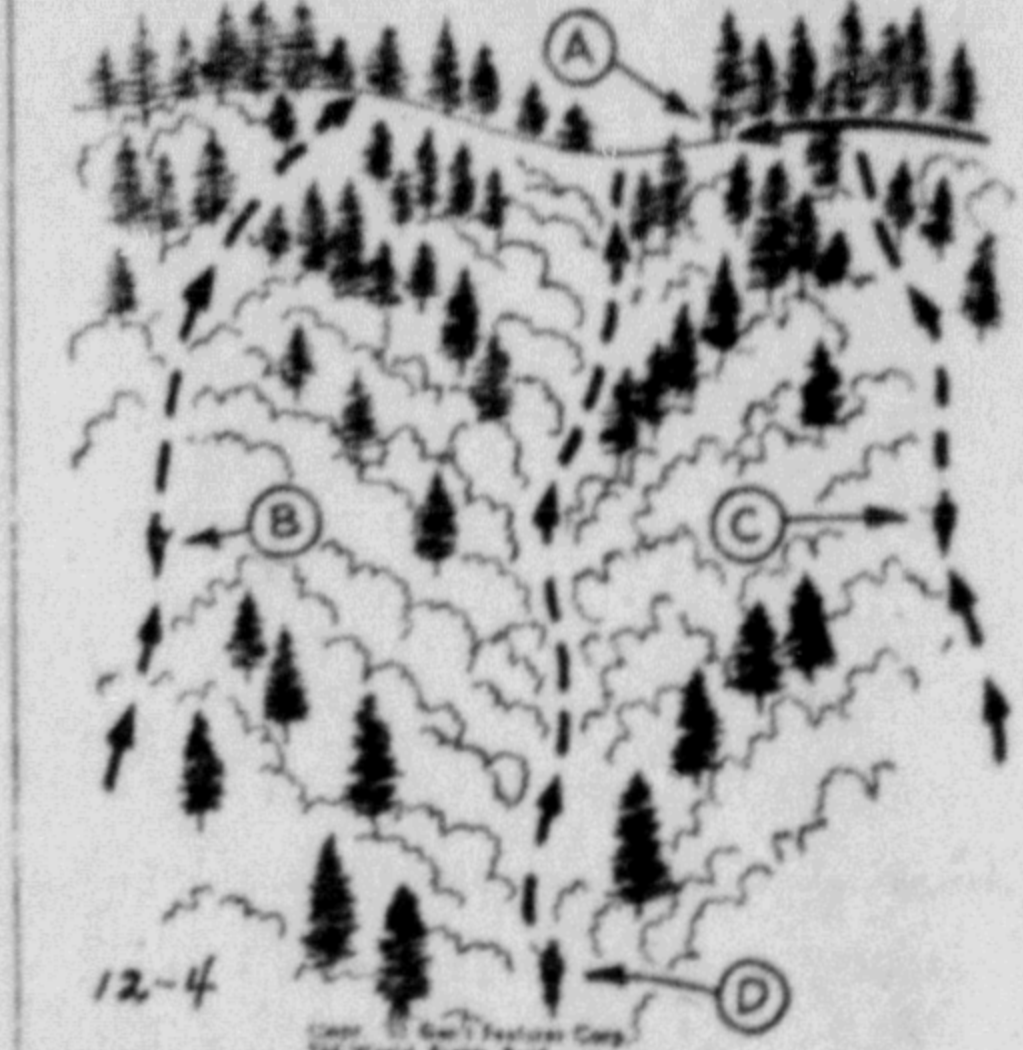
