band were underweight.

CONVERSION OF WILLIAMS In May, 1926, Louisa, daughter of Chief Williams married Johnson Alexander, heir to the crown of Chief Patsy

of Hazelton. Johnson is a Catholic and Louisa then embraced the Catholic faith. They were married by the priest in the presence of the Burns Lake chief and his wife. Louisa, who has a fair education, wrote to her parents and informed them that she was a Catholic.

Chief Williams, who is now 78 years old is well acquainted with the work of the Catholic Church carried on right here at Hakwilget, twelve miles from Kispiox since the year 1869. So when the news of his beloved daughter being a Catholic reached him he thought to quit his superstitious life and to be-

come a christian in the Catholic Church. There was nothing done for over a year. The priest who had received Louisa into the Church had gone to fulfill a mission in Europe. It was Father Joseph Allard, O.M.I., the writer. On November 22, 1927, I was at Burns Lake, one of my missions, 160 miles from Kispiox. There I received the following telegram: "Come quick. Chief Williams and family want you. Son dying." The message was signed "John Alexander." New Hazelton, B.C.
