During the past 24 hours, fifty carloads of grain have arrived from the prairies for the Alberta Wheat Pool's Prince Rupert elevator. Railway offices this morning reported 250 cars on the division west of Jasper Park bound here.

Editor, Daily News. I do not know who your "Man in the Moon" is, nor whether he wishes or expects an answer to his query as to "whether it was parental neglect or child murder that caused the death of the new Province scheme." If he does, I should be glad to give him my opinion for what it is worth.

In the first place I do not agree with his conclusion. The scheme is not dead, but sleepeth. One of the chief reasons why it sleeps is because the leading newspaper of the North, which we naturally expect to assume the lead in such matters, has taken no decided stand one way or the other, but treats the issue in a highly supercilious manner.

Why your publication takes the attitude that it does on this question is of course known better to yourself. I notice that in the same issue of your paper as contained the Man in the Moon squib, there was also an intimation that one of the Provincial Government Ministers had warned a certain section of this district to go slow on the new province question.

If the scheme is, as your Man in the Moon says, dead, it has most assuredly been killed by neglect, parental or otherwise, and has not been murdered by any argument that has been advanced against it.

TROLLER POLARIS LIBELLED KETCHIKAN

KETCHIKAN, Feb. 2--By order of the United States district attorney the trolley boat Polaris, William McHale owner, was libelled by the government as growing out of a charge of violating the liquor laws.

Officers claim that a still and 15 quarts of moonshine was found on the boat. They assert that the whole arrangement was exceptionally sanitary with "clear liquor."

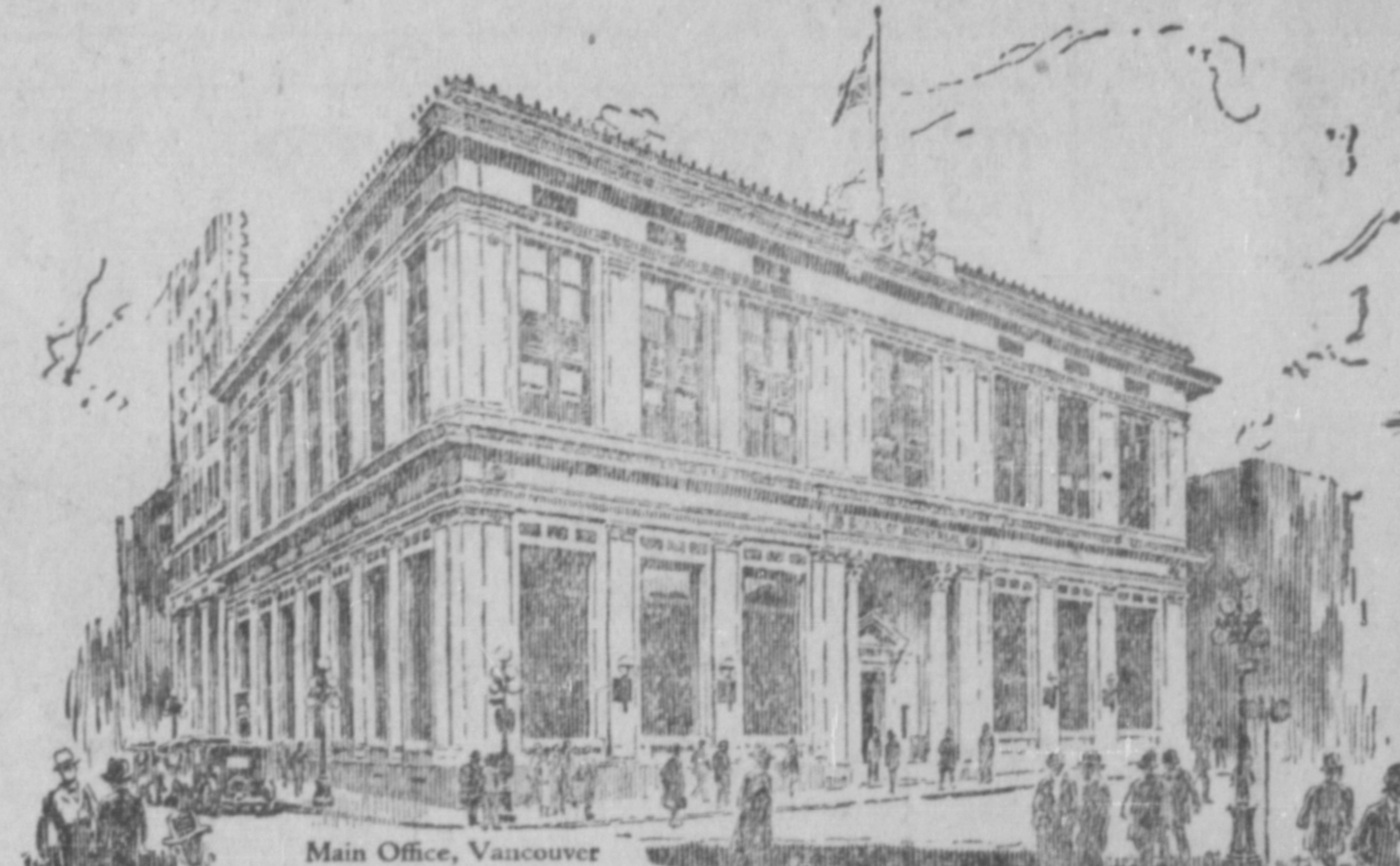
