FISHING BOATS BEFORE COURT

Several Well-known Craft Concerned in Law Cases in Alaska Just Now

KETCHIKAN, Feb. 2.—Several admiralty cases are now pending before the district court, one of which includes the power boat M. & M. taken on the west coast and charged with illegal fishing; the case against the Commonwealth for damage to the Anna J. through alleged carelessness, and the one in which the Monroe charged the Gladstone with crashing into her near Sitka.

The case against the Commonwealth is set for February 6. The M. & M. case probably will be tried in Juneau. Arne Suomela, United States fishery warden of Bristol bay, arrived here in connection with the latter case.

Recently the court fixed the bail of the Gladstone at \$10,000 for the release of the boat for the fishing season. She is a halibuter. The Monroe was hauling salmon at the time of the accident and claims that she was on her course when run into by the other boat.
