## Papers in Regard to Breaking Relations with Russian Soviet

Canadian Government Convinced Agreement Not Being Carried Out and Unity of Action Suggested as Being Desirable

OTTAWA, March 15 .- That Canada broke off official trade relations with the Soviet government last May because of the conviction in the minds of the members of the Canadian government that the Soviets had not fulfilled their promise to refrain from hostile action against the institutions of the British Empire, is disclosed in documents tabled in the House of Commons today.

The British government drew attention to the fact that the terms of the Russian agreement of 1923 in regard to the United Kingdom would not necessarily terminate the operation of the

agreement as between Russia and Canada, but it was suggested by Mr. Amery that "uniformity of action by the various members of the commonwealth concerned would present a great advantage."
