The peak which skirt the Tonquin Valley in Jasper National Park, Alberta, will have attention before camp is moved to Ber Lake behind Mount Robson, B.C., th highest peak in the Canadian Rockies

The Tonquin Valley group is known as the Ramparts and it features Moun Geikie, Turret, Bastion, Redoubt, Dun geon, Fraser, Erebus and Eremite. To the rear lie Postern and Casemite, two great peaks which have not been climbed. The Alpine Club of Canad: held its 1926 camp in this area.

Three hundred members of the clul from Los Angeles and San Francisco wil make the trip. Leaving San Francisco on July 7 they will proceed to Van couver and from there by special train over the Canadian National Railways t Jasper where a full day will be spen at Jasper Park Lodge. They will then return west as far as Geikie, the first station west of Jasper, and from there follow the Meadow Creek trail to the Tonquin Valley, a distance of 14 miles They will remain in the Tonquin fron July 11 to July 18 when they continue west to Mount Robson station. From there they will follow the Grand Fork trail, Kinney Lake and the Valley of Thousand Falls to Berg Lake where camp will be established. They remain in this district until August 3 wher they entrain for Prince Rupert, B.C. from where they return to Vancouver by Canadian National Steamships.



Income lax Returns

The law states that penalties must be imposed after that date

HE Department of National Revenue urges all Dominion Income Taxpayers to file returns without delay.

The official forms may be obtained at any Post Office or by writing the Inspector of Income Tax for your district. Two copies, proparly filled in, together with an accepted cheque or express or money order for the full amount of the tax, or the first installment as you desire, must be mailed to the Inspector of Income Tax, for your district, not later than April 30. Cheques must be made payable to The Receiver General of Canada.

Even though you may believe you are not liable to tax, you are advised to file a return before April 30 if your income in 1927 was more than \$1,500.

For your convenience a few of the outstanding provisions of The Income Tax Law are explained in this advertisement.

Three Kinds of Forms

There are three kinds of Dominion Income Tax Forms, one of which will apply to any tax payer. The different forms are:

Form T 1 -For all individuals, other than farmers or ranchers.

Form T 1A-For farmers and ranchers. Form T 2 -For corporations and joint stock companies.

If you so desire, the Inspector of Income Tax for your district will send you upon written request a revised copy of The Income War Tax Act, Consolidated, Chapter 97 (R.S.C. 1927).

Income from All Sources Must be Declared

The public is especially reminded to report all income from bearer bonds-whether Dominion, Provincial, Municipal or Industrial. The interest from these bonds is taxable. The 1928 legislation enlarges the powers of the department which is now enabled to trace the ownerchip of all bearer bonds.

Personal Exemptions

Personal exemptions should be noted carefully. They may be summarized as follows: (a) \$3,000 in the case of a married person or householder, or any other person who has your district.

dependent upon him any of the following persons:

- 1. A parent or grand-parent.
- 2. A daughter or sister.
- 3. A son or brother under 21 years of age; or incapable of self-support on account of mental or physical infirmity-except where the husband and wife each have a separate income in excess of \$1,500, then each shall receive not \$3,000 exemption, but \$1,500 exemption.

(b) \$1,500 in the case of unmarried persons.

(c) \$500 for each child under 21 years of age who is dependent upon the tax payer for support, or if 21 years of age or over is incapable of self-support on account of mental or physical infirmity.

Send Cheque with the Return

Income tax may be paid either in a lump sum or in four installments, plus interest. An accepted cheque or express or money order for either the full amount or the amount of the first installment must accompany the official forms. Do not send cash. April 30 is the last

The return and the cheque are to be mailed to the Inspector of Dominion Income Tax for

Cheques are to be made payable to "The Receiver General of Canada." Cheques must be marked "accepted" by the bank on which drawn.

FILE YOUR RETURN ON OR BEFORE APRIL 30.

If you delay making Income Tax returns the penalties provided by the Act must be imposed.
