WASHINGTON, D.C., July 7.-Evpert and strategic war against diamond smugglers will be pursued by the customs bureau of the treasury department if congress grants \$103,000 in additional annual funds. Diamond smuggling has become so

widespread and is carried on by such experts, says E. W. Camp, commissioner of customs, that it will take a powerful crew to stop the evil.

The 20 per cent duty on cut diamonds in the United States has fostered the growth of the illegal industry, and officials estimate the annual loss to revenue coffers at \$8,000,000 to \$10,000,000.
