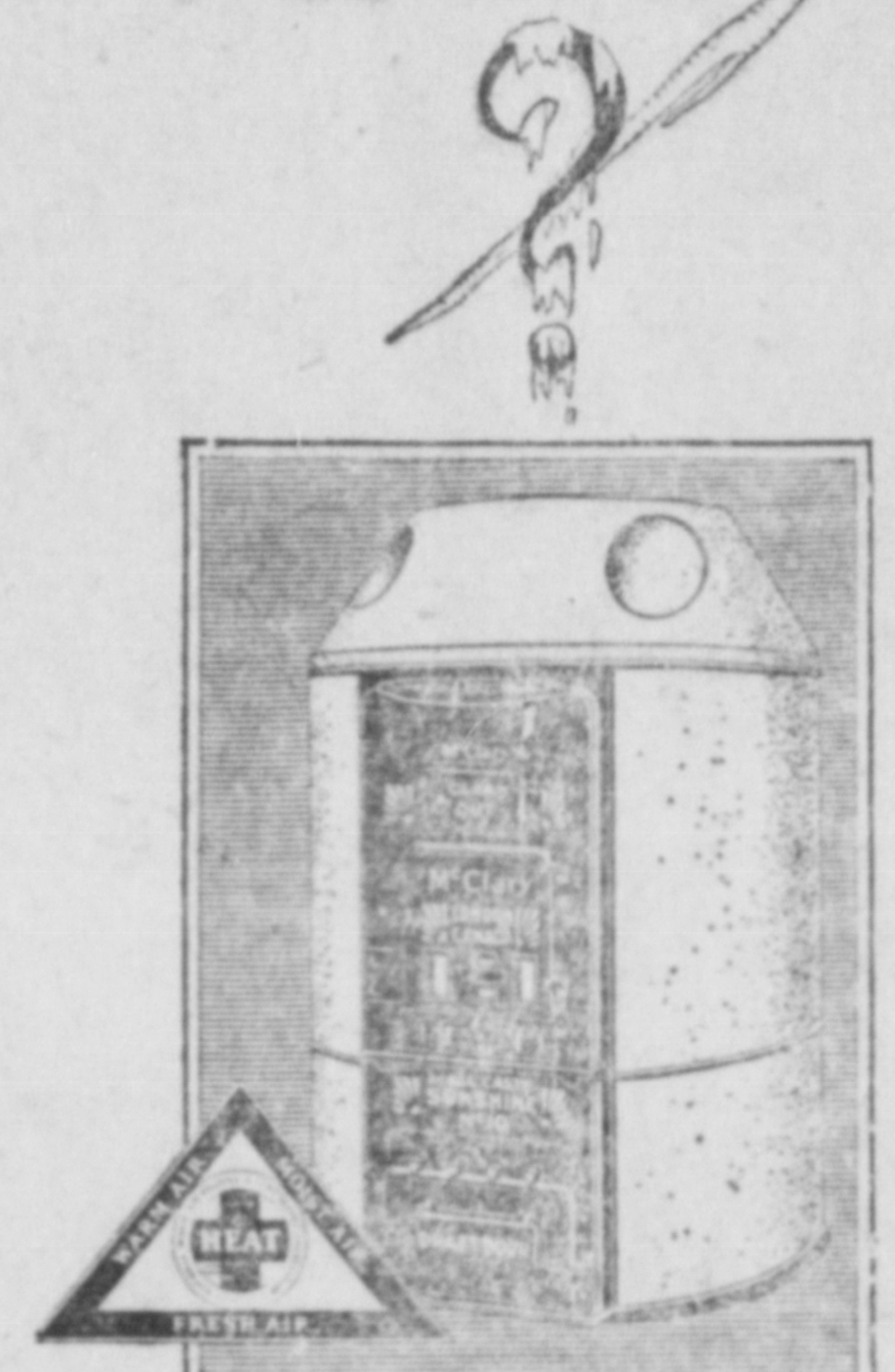

TRUANCY OF BAND BOYS

The trustees had assented to this with the exception of the chairman and he had not objected. Originally the holiday was to have been on Wednesday and the members of the band were also to get Thursday. When the holiday was changed the afternoon off was changed. Trustee Gilchrist blamed the chairman for not notifying the principals and Mr. Rochester refused to take the blame saying he had heard nothing about Friday off.

A letter will be written to the bandmaster stating that boys must not stay away from school to play in the band.

DRIVE SLOWLY PAST SCHOOLS

Complaint Made at Board Meeting Last Night of Cars on Borden Street

The safety of pupils attending Borden Street school was discussed at some length last night, it being reported by the principal Miss Mills, that cars were in the habit of driving fast past the school when the children were coming or going and there was no sidewalk for them west of the school. Also drivers of cars had a habit of backing down and turning in the school entrance disturbing the school. It was decided after considerable discussion to put up "Go Slow" notices and also a trespassers warning notice at the school. If this fails the police will be asked to aid in protecting the school. It was also suggested that perhaps the city could be induced to build the sidewalk west of the school.

Dwelling Complained About at Recent Meeting is on Provincial Government Property

Mayor Reports Mayor McMordie reported at last night's council meeting that as instructed two weeks ago, he had made investigations as to the house at the corner of Third Avenue and Cow Bay road regarding which complaints had been made. The house, he was informed by the city engineer, was on provincial government property, being occupied by J. T. Cook, and the city had no authority to take any action with a view to its removal. If a silent policeman were installed at that intersection, it might tend to reduce the hazard to traffic through the house obscuring the view.

Ald. Collart felt that the neighborhood thereabouts was unsanitary and should be looked into by medical health officer. Ald. Tinker agreed that something should be done so it was decided to have a report from the medical health officer on the matter.

The mayor also reported that he had looked into the matter of a complaint made by J. A. Curran as to refuse around his premises. Steps had been taken toward remedying the matter.
