

The British steamer Rossington Court, Prince Rupert's fourth grain ship of the season, is expected to arrive in port late this afternoon or early this evening from the old country and will immediately go on berth at the elevator to start loading a full cargo for the United Kingdom or continent. The vessel was due at Triple Island at 1 o'clock this afternoon to pick up her pilot.

No further boats for loading here have yet been reported. Meantime, the Alberta Wheat Pool's local elevator is filled to capacity and the movement of grain from the prairies to Prince Rupert has, consequently, slackened up.
