It is better to choose pictures from time to time than to go to a store and buy a lo of stuff not at all suited to the rooms. The musical art can be studied in the home and in the schools.

The gramophones have done much to encourage this and the radio carrying it on very successfully. However, this should never take place of musical training. As a general principal every child should understand the




