hand today but he finally de- Neither side vulnerable cided on the king of spudes. The defence might have been a little easier if he had opened the king of clubs but he had no way to be sure of that.

Miss Brash let the king of spades hold and Mr. Abel had nother chance at the winning defence. Hoping to get Mr. Dale in to lead a diamond back, he came out with a low club. But Miss Brash won, cashed the ace of trumps, finessed the jack of spades and threw off a diamond West on the ace of spades. Thus she 10 lost only a spade, a heart and 2 NT a diamond, making her doubled contract.

You and I see that he could have defeated the hand by switching to diamonds at trick two. It's tough leading from an ace-queen, but Mr. Abel should have seen it, too ...

Mr. Dale had to have something for his raise to two clubs. He had nothing in spades. On the bidding it was practically certain he had no winners in hearts. He should have either the ace of clubs or the king of


