

CANADIAN PREMIER PRE SENTS KING GEORGE WITH GOLD MEDAL

Thirty-one Killed In Train Collision When Express Is Wrecked

BUCHAREST, Roumania, Oct. 26.-Thirty- one perns were killed today in a collision between the Symplon Funnel express from Bucharest and an express train from Sybiu near Slatina. Forty-seven persons were injured.

The force of the collision was so great that one of the sleeping cars of the Symplon Express was completely wrecked. Two of the first class coaches were smashed.

The accident was due to failure of the switch points o work.

The Symplon Express is one of the best known trains in Europe.
