## Mansons Down Gordon & Anderson To Creep Within Point of Leaders

### Main Lodge Redecorated

Week-end activity on Mt. Hays is centred on redecoration of the main lodge and clearing of ski runs in the 1952-53 expansion program of the Prince Rupert Ski Club.

Several new members have joined and the club anticipates "the most active season to date," as all cabins have been allotted and further space made available by arranging a dormitory for male transients.

An innovation this year is the serving of coffee in the main lodge for Sunday hikers and skiers. Those without skis will find this equipment available for rent.

Mansons, playing their best game of the season, dumped Gordon & Anderson 51-49 at the Civic Centre gym last night to put them one point behind the league-leaders.

While both teams missed numerous chances to score because of over-shooting, Ray Spring led the red-sweatered Manson squad with 19 points. He was followed closely by big Art Olsen, who bagged 14 and was a powerhouse in the final half in holding off repeated scoring attempts by the blue-shirts.

Lanky Joe Davis was the best man for the Blues, although his timing was off and he bagged only 14 points. Jimmy Flaten

came through nicely in the fourth quarter to chalk up seven of his 11 points. Jim Hebb kept Mansons alert throughout the game with his many dangerous shots, but he also missed several "easy" ones and ended with 14 points for his evening's effort.

Score at the end of the first quarter saw the two teams tied at 6-6. Mansons got the lead halfway through the second quarter and at half time held a 23-20 advantage.

They never lost the lead although there were some near threats. At three-quarter time the winners led 36-31. Verne Clecone and Ole Slatta kept the game orderly throughout and the small crowd was kept on edge as the teams vied for the lead in the early stages.

Gordon & Anderson, whose lead in the three-team circuit was cut to one point by last night's game, pressed hard but appeared to be forcing play and were caught off guard often.

Newcomer to senior play, Ron Webber, played a neat game for the losers but his "shooting eye" failed him and he scored only two points. His floor play excelled but he failed to take enough time around the basket and his attempts repeatedly went wild.

Ray Spring and Art Olsen carried the weight for Mansons although "Big Art" couldn't find the mark until the third quarter.

Gordon & Anderson took time out three times in the dying minutes of the final quarter to discuss strategy but their efforts fell short, mainly due to poor shooting. With the score 51-47 in favor of Mansons, young Webber twice was in a scoring position but missed the cage. Hebb got the last points for the Blues with a long-sailing shot as the gong sounded.

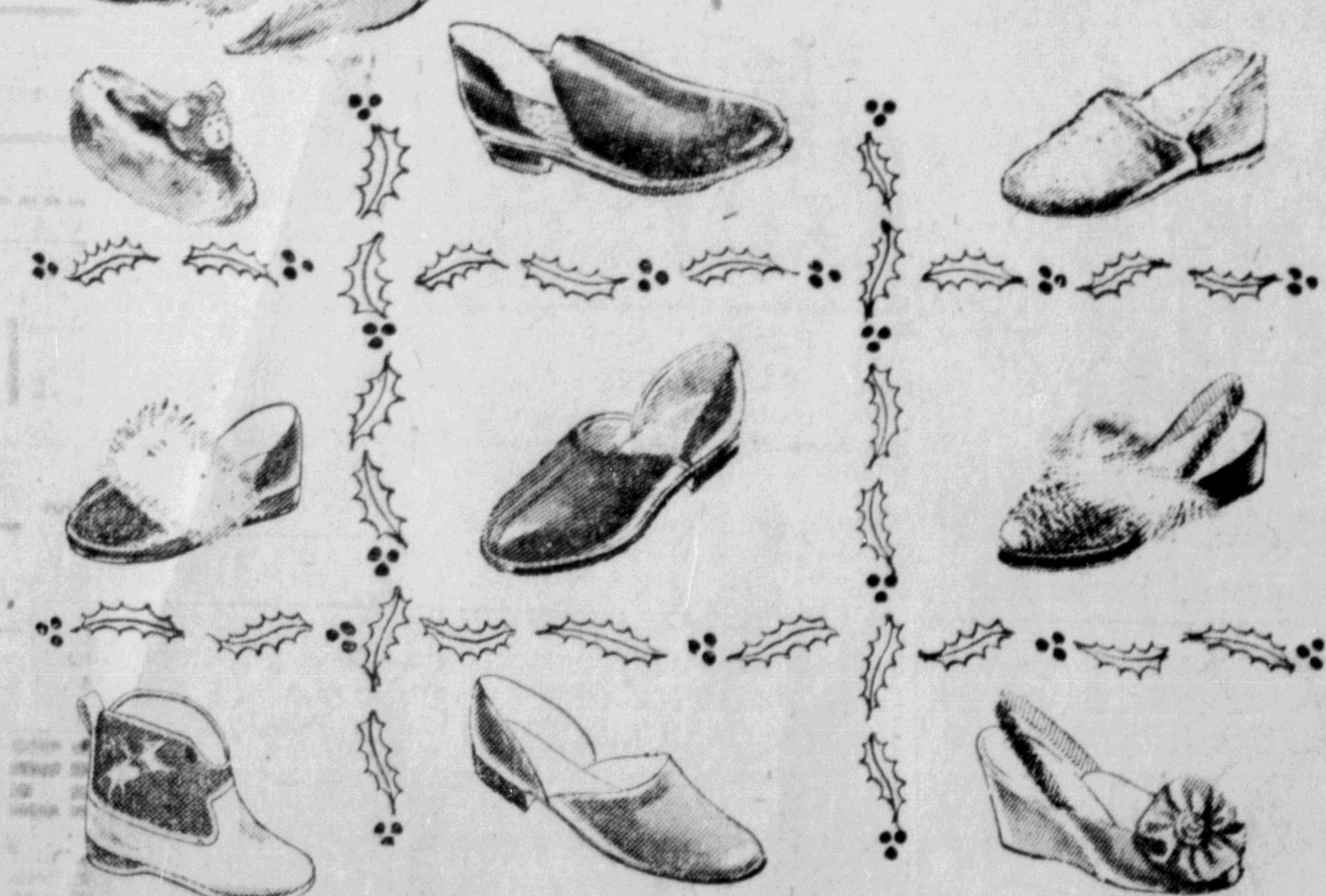
