

FIRE LOSS HERE FOR YEAR IS VERY LIGHT

Total Damage So Far Estimated at \$798, as Compared With \$7,214.98 in 1927

Fire loss in Prince Rupert this year to date amounts to only \$798, as compared with 7,214.98 for the first 11 months of 1927. During the month of November, just ended, the fire department responded to six calls, damage being estimated at about \$25. Last year in November there were three calls and no damage.

CUSTOMS COLLECTIONS THIS YEAR ARE LOWER

Revenue for November Was \$17,759.52; Figures This Year Considerably Down From Last

Customs and excise collections for the month of November amounted to \$17,759.52, as compared with \$18,071.96 during the same month last year, according to announcement made this morning by J. H. McLeod, collector of customs. Collections for the year to date stand at \$261,371.26, as compared with \$317,932.27 for the first 11 months of 1927.
