ADDRESS TODAY UNITED FARMER ORGANIZATION

Retiring President at Portage Convention Tells of Aims and Objects

PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE, Man. Jan. 11.—Established on a bed rock foundation of vital and concrete principles and ideals, the United Farmers of Manitoba, will continue to function as an agency of inestimable importance as long as the rank and file stand solidly together and labor strenuously to make the future worthy of the heritage of the pioneers of the movement.

This was the message given here today to delegates attending the annual convention of the United Farmers of Manitoba, by A. J. M. Poole, retiring president of the organization. Mr. Poole reviewed exhaustively the achievements and examined the history of its progress since the inception of the U.F.M. twenty-five years ago.

"Thorough organization of the farmers of Manitoba," the president declared, "one of those voluntary agencies for human betterment, which are so common and beneficent a feature of our modern democracy, was brought into being. It has proved its worth through all the vicissitudes and varied changes of a quarter of a century, and today it stands as a vitally indispensable function of our life—a function which it should be our most earnest and whole-hearted endeavor to perpetuate."

The farmers' organization set up in 1903, the speaker said, had characteristics that were exclusively its own. It was something apart from what today had come to be known as "class organization" of an "occasional group." When first the farmers had come together it had been primarily to consult in regard to protecting their economic interests. Working on from the initial effort they permitted their organization to make whatever form and character that from time to time seemed best to meet the requirements of the situation.

"From the earliest stage," Mr. Poole

continued, "the farmers recognized that in order to secure satisfying life on the land, adequate social conditions must be created. The movement applied itself to develop, to elevate and to unify the social relationships of the farmers. "This feature of the movement had far reaching effects. It meant that the association was a gathering of neighbors prompted by cordial good will, not exclusive and rigidly guarded order. Instead of the "close door" the door has ever been open to every sympathetic element in the community."

In actual fact and practice the principles advocated and objectives sought by the organizations had seldom, if ever, been of the kind that might be termed "extreme" Mr. Poole said.

JAPAN EXPECTS HAVE ELECTION

Universal Manhood Suffrage to be Tried in That Country for First Time

NEW YORK, Jan. 11.—The first general election on the basis of universal manhood suffrage next year will usher in a new day in Japanese politics, Yusuke Tsurumi, stated at an interview here.

"Japan in the past has been considered more or less as a country where a few people ruled and governed," said Tsurumi speaking of the new election law which will increase Japanese voters from 10,000,000 to 13,000,000. "But with this stupendous increase of voters, coupled with the changing psychology among the voters, Japan as a political unit is getting more and more like Great Britain, the United States and France."
