DAILY STEAMER RUN IS MOOTED

NEW COAST SHIPS FOR C.N.R. WILL ALLOW OF GREATLY IMPROVED SERVICE

The contract figure for the steel car barge which is to be built at Prince Rupert is higher than the price announced by Sir Hery Thornton recently. It will cost \$160,000 and it is planned to have the work finished in about six months. Building this craft will employ a large number of skilled mechanics and the payroll will be considerable.

In connection with the new coast steamers for which Parliament will be asked to vote the money at the next session of the House, it is said that it is planned to give a daily steamer service to Prince Rupert in 1930. At least twice a week ships would make the run to Alaskan points in the summer and the others would serve Portland Canal or possibly in some cases turn around and go south, making Prince Rupert the terminus.

It is pointed out that in order to make the Prince Rupert section of the railway a success it is desirable to have a steamer meet each train. This would enable passengers to stop off a day at Prince Rupert if they wished and would tend to popularize the triangular route and the coast steamships.

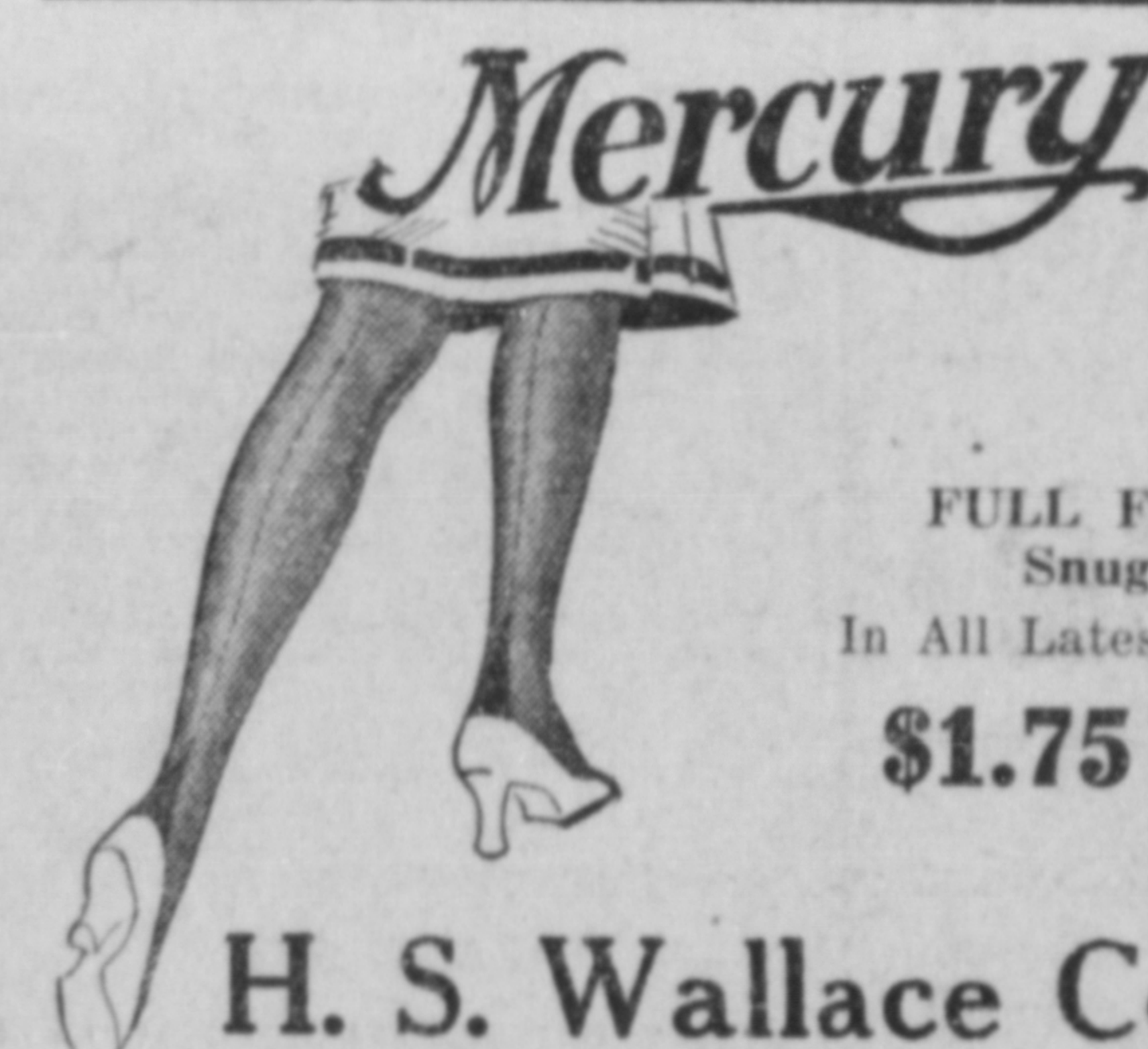
