MUCH BUILDING IN VICTORIA

TWO MILLION DOLLARS WORTH OF
CONTRACTS NOW UNDER WAY
IN DISTRICT

VICTORIA, March 16.—With contracts valued at nearly \$2,000,000 under way in the city at the present time and new construction work totalling \$500,000 about to be commenced, Victoria has gained a splendid start in building operations for the year 1928.

Apart from the important building work that is actually in progress, embracing the new Christ Church Cathedral, St. Joseph's Hospital wing, the Ogden Point grain elevator, the Government printery and stage terminals, which represent an aggregate value of \$1,700,000, considerable residence construction is proceeding, and is in immediate contemplation.

Tenders have been received by Architect Percy Fox for the worsted mill of the British Columbia Worsteds Limited to be erected on Montreal Street, and which, together with the plant to be installed, will represent an expenditure of about \$100,000.

The B.C.E.R. has acquired property at the intersection of Government and Bay Streets preliminary to the construction of a power and light distributing plant at an estimated cost of \$250,000.

NEW RESIDENCES

In residence construction the city looks for a big year. In addition to a \$17,000 residence designed by Ralph Berrill to be built on Despard Avenue for Gilbert Fraser, the contract for which has been awarded to Hunter and Halket, another fine home valued at \$15,000 and designed by Sam MacLure.



SAN FRANCISCO, March 16.—Efforts to arrange a merger of eight Alaskan salmon canneries were continued here, although the conferees announced they had been unable to reach a decision. They said they would continue conferences.

The conferees said they represented small independent canneries operating on the southeastern Alaska coast and sought consolidation to meet more aggressively the competition of the Pacific American Fisheries Company of Bellingham, which owns the Port Edward Cannery on the Skeena River and the Alaska Packers of San Francisco.
