Halibut Landings Show Falling off After Light Week-New Fishing Boats Leave for Their Work-P.R.B.H. Sale

Due to light landings during the short week preceding Easter Friday, the record of halibut fares at Prince Rupert for this season had fallen behind that of 1927 yesterday. The total landings for the season to that date stood at 3,658,800 pounds as compared with 3,779,200 pounds on the corresponding date in 1927. There are a number of large boats due to land their catches during the coming week, however, and the chances are that the falling back for this season will be but temporary.

During the week of Saturday to Friday inclusive landings here totalled 420,000 pounds-75,500 pounds Canadian and 344,500 pounds American—as compared with a total of 829,900 pounds during the corresponding week last year.
