PRINCE RUPERT IS URGED TO ATTEND BIG CONVENTION

At the Board of Trade meeting last night letters were received from the Canadian Chamber of Commerce in regard to the convention to be held at Calgary and Edmonton next year, including a tour of the Peace River country and asking that as large a representation as possible from the west be present.

A letter in regard to the same was received from Vancouver also urging the importance of the west taking its share in the convention and suggesting that at least one representative from each board be present.

OTTAWA MINISTER PROMISE CONSIDER AIDS TO NAVIGATION
