Following reception of a report from Principal Feddie suggesting that pupils coming up to the High, School by recommendation were not ready for the work, the school board last night by resolution decided to request the Department of Education at Victoria to held examinations in the local schools for all pupils wishing to enter High School instead of taking the recommendation of the principals. One particular class was mentioned which was passed in toto.

In a discussion in regard to the matter it was pointed out by Chairman Rochester that there was no comeack if the students took the examnations. He was strongly in favor of

The results pointed to the necessity of a junior high school or a supplementary class in the elementary school.


