The C.N.R. steamer Prince Charles is scheduled to call at Englewood on its southern journey this week to take on a party of workmen from the plant there.

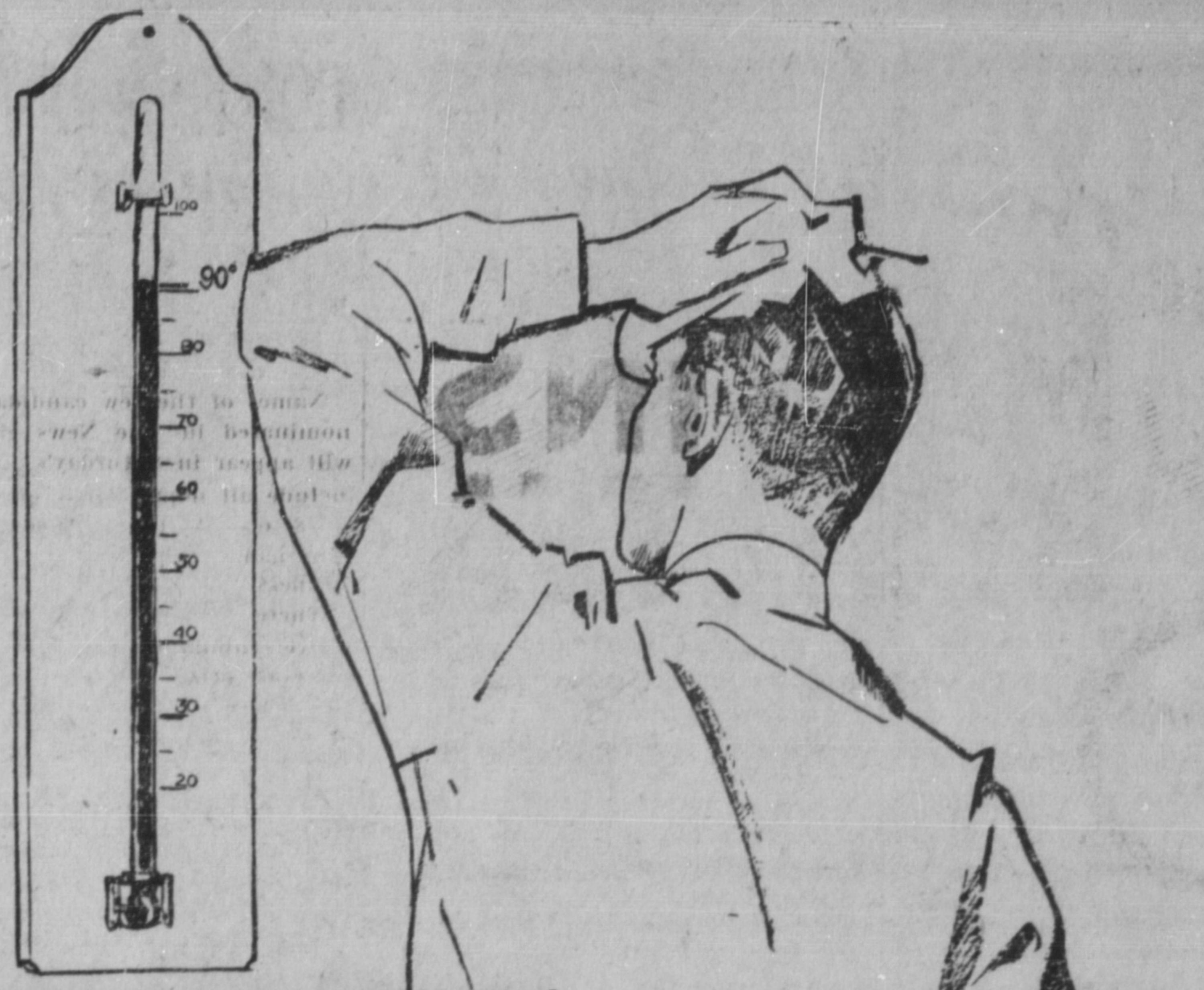

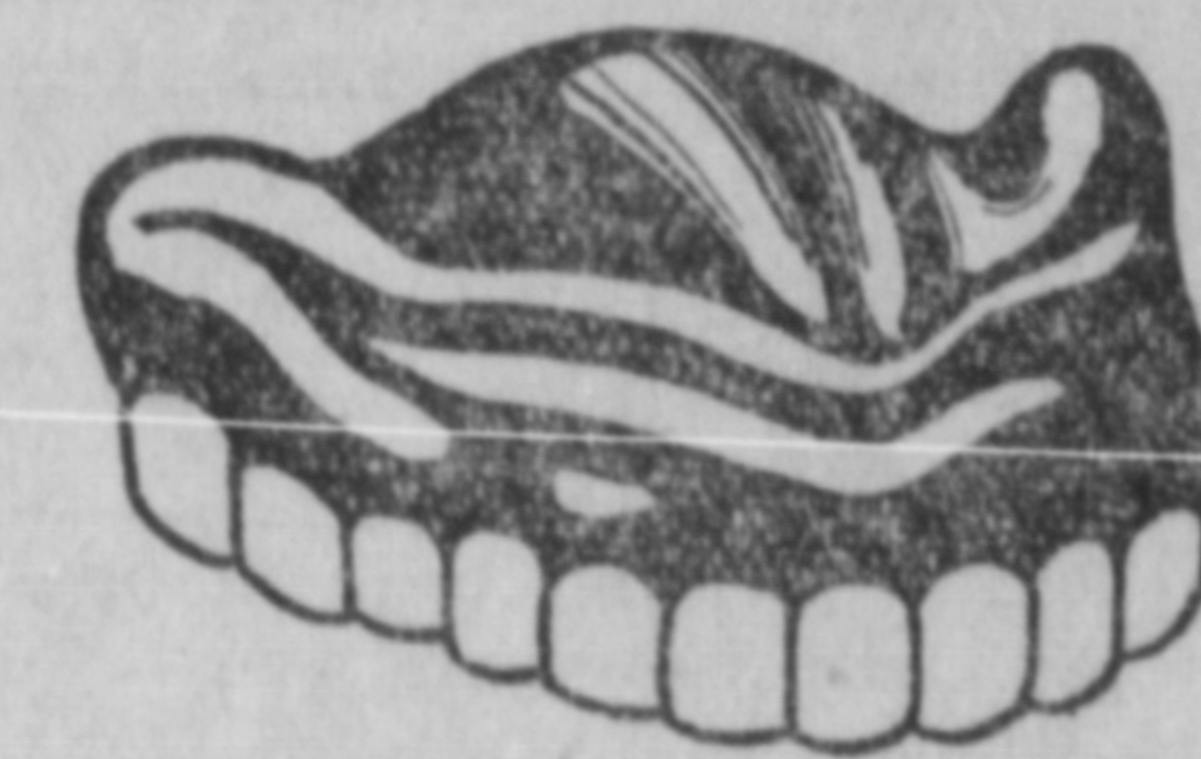
