BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Masters Demonstrates a Play To Remember
In making the killing defensive play on this hand, Mr. Masters followed a principle which seems to be known by very few players. Not that there's anything intricate about it. In fact, it's easy to remember and it will help you to defeat a lot of other-wise makable contracts.

Mrs. Keen opened the five of hearts, the four went on dummy and Mr. Masters played the eight. Mr. Abel false-carded with the ace, fooling nobody at all. Mr. Masters knew that if it took the ace to beat his eight, then Mrs. Keen must have queen, jack and 10. But with that holding she would have led the queen.

As for Mrs. Keen, she knew that the queen was in the closed hand because if Mr. Masters had it, he would have played it instead of the lowly eight.

At trick two Mr. Abel led the eight of clubs and let it go. Mr. Masters won with the king and it was clear to him that if the contract could be set at all, it had to be set now—before Mr. Abel regained the lead.

There was only one card Mr. Masters could lead at this point which would accomplish the set. That card was the 10 of diamonds. He led it, of course, and Mr. Abel covered with the queen. The ace won and a small diamond return put Mr. Masters in again with the king. He now led the deuce and Mrs. Keen had the jack-seven over Mr. Abel's eight-six.

Note that the king or deuce of diamonds at trick three would not have done as well. On the lead of the king first, Mr. Abel's eight would finally stop the suit. If the deuce is led first, Mr. Abel would duck and the jack would win. Mrs. Keen would return the five to Mr. Masters' king. But now, on the

lead of the 10, Mr. Abel would duck and Mrs. Keen could not overtake with the ace without setting up the queen.

In similar situations, then, when leading up to weakness in dummy, it is usually best to lead the lowest card you have which is higher than dummy's highest card in the suit.

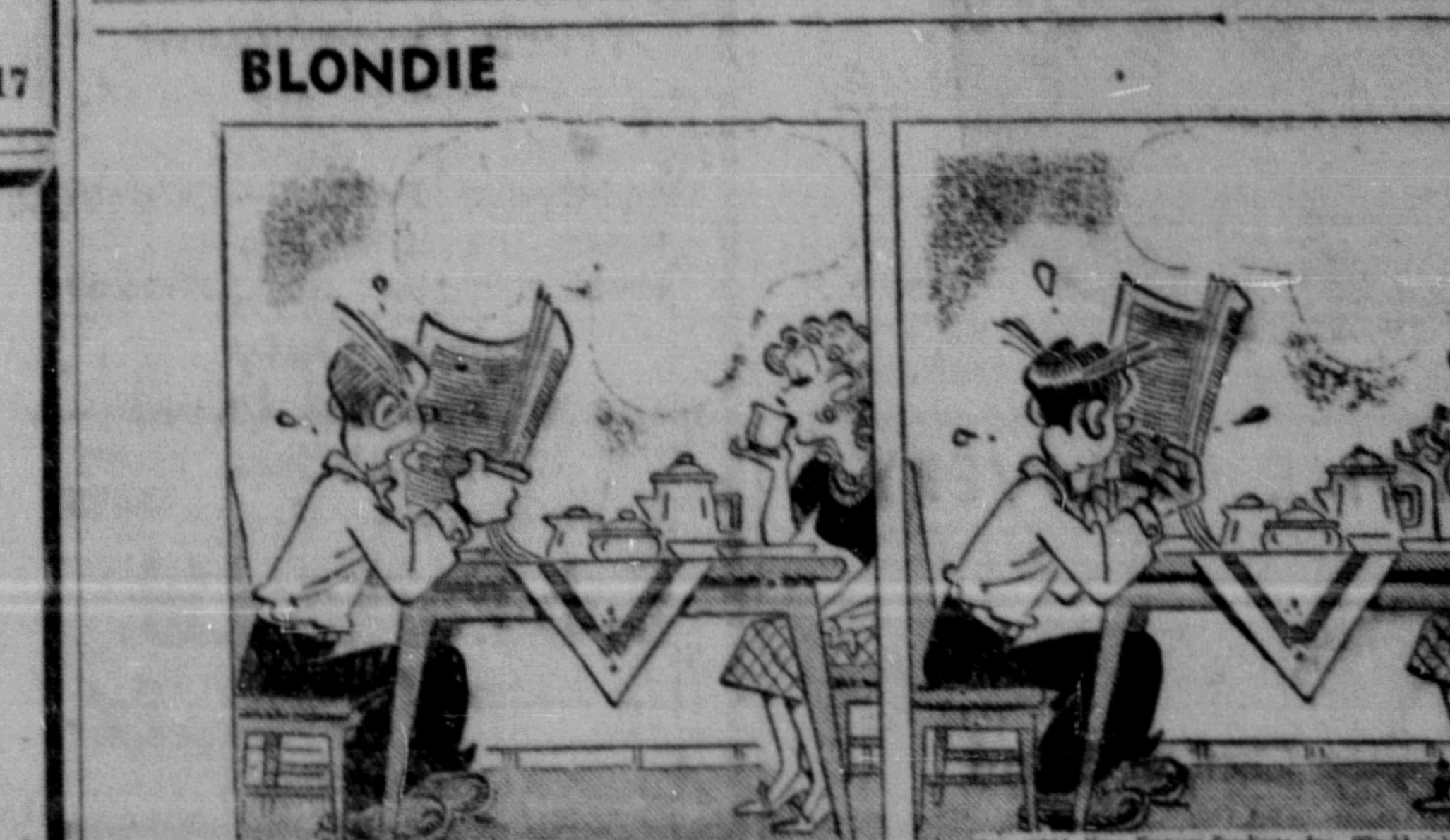
