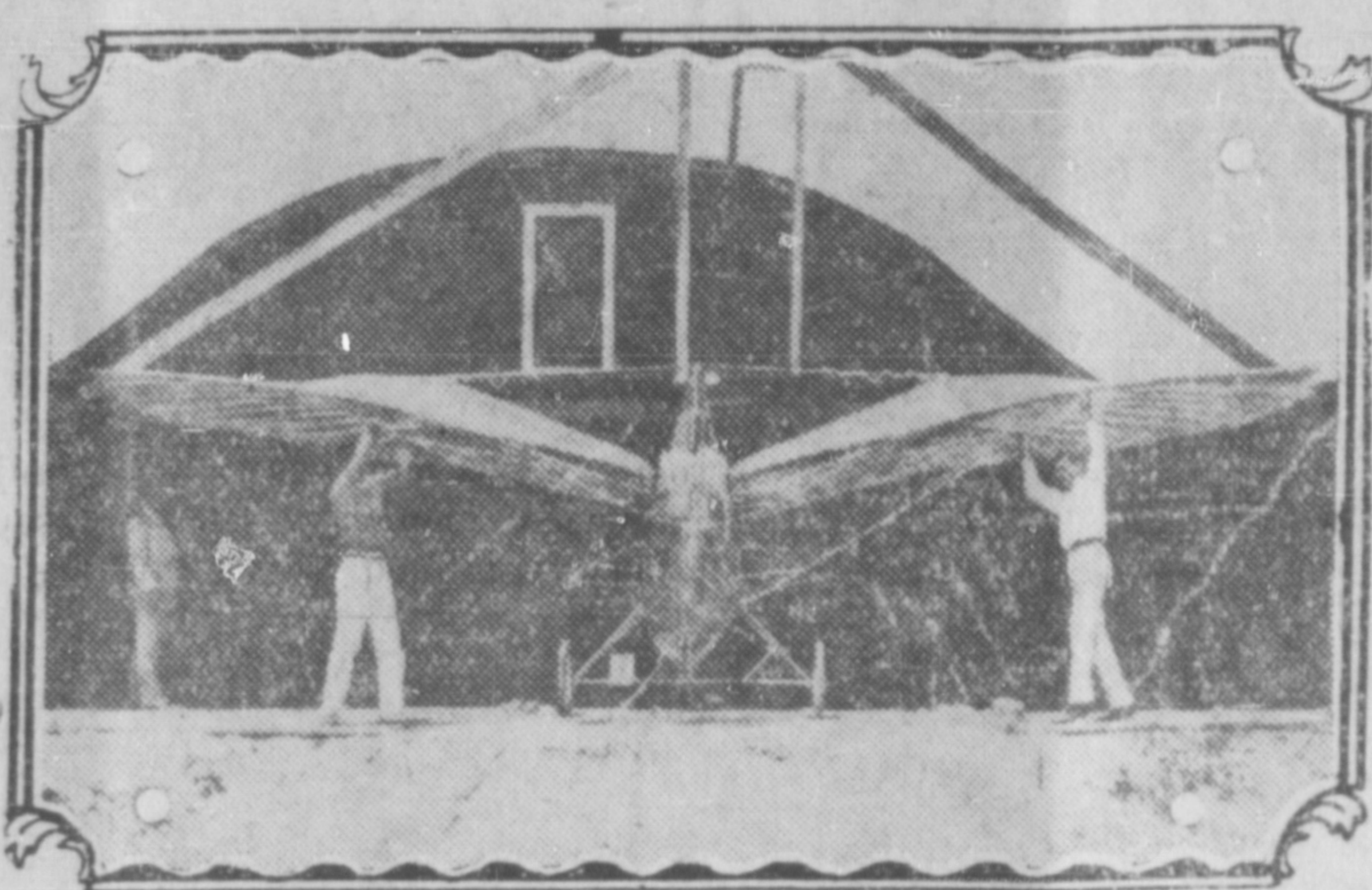
WESTERN ROUTE IS PRAISED BY GRAIN BUYERS

(Edmonton Journal)

Further evidence has been presented that last year's western Canadian wheat crop was under-estimated. The C.P.R. superintendent of transportation reports that that railway and the C.N.R. has marketed approximately 380,450,000 bushels. This, with the allowance for feed, seed and grist mills, brings the total about 6,500,000 over the dominion government's final figure, while it is believed that 15,000,000 to 20,000,000 is still in the farmers' hands.

Alberta, it is evident, is more than responsible for the difference. The grain exported through Vancouver was nearly 73,000,000 at the end of May, and it is expected that it will reach 85,000,000 by the end of the crop year. This will be 30,000,000 in excess of the best previous record.

Towards the end of 1926 charges were made that the Alberta pool was discriminating against the western route. These were denied and it was explained how temporary conditions had effected the shipments in that direction. There can be no doubt how extensively the pool has utilized the route during the present crop year. At the Regina conference one of its spokesmen, Mr.

FIELD DAYS IN INTERIOR

EXPERTS TO VISIT VARIOUS PARTS OF CENTRAL B.C.

The Experimental Farms branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture will hold field days on the illustration stations in Central British Columbia in early July. Meetings will also be held at Wisteria and Quesnel.

The schedule of meetings is as follows—Smithers, July 3; Telkwa, July 4; Wisteria, July 5; Francois Lake, July 7; Vanderhoof, July 9; Quesnel, July 10; Prince George, July 11; Salmon Valley, July 12; and McBride, July 13.

Visiting speakers are Professor H. M. King, head of the Animal Husbandry Department University of B.C., Vancouver, B.C., and Mr. D. C. Denny, poultry specialist, Dominion Experimental Station, Summerland, B.C.

D. D. Munroe and S. S. Phillips in the Bulkley Valley, district agriculturists, R. G. Sutton, Prince George, and C. C. Kelly, Williams Lake, are assisting with the program. The farmers' institutes and boards of trade are co-operating at various points to make the field days a success.

NOTED HORSE RACING MAN IS CITY VISITOR

Jack Atkin, Wealthy California Horse Owner and Former Tijuana Manager Here Today

Jack Atkin, widely known race horse handicapper and formerly manager of the Tijuana track in Mexico, accompanied by his wife and family, arrived in the city from the south on the Prince George this morning and proceeded by train to Jasper Park where he will spend a few days before proceeding to New York whence he will embark for a visit to his former home in Scarborough, England. It was forty-five years ago since Mr. Atkin sailed around Cape Horn from England and landed in San Francisco. His experiences in America have included owning a circus, instituting the Cofroth Handicap and making some of the largest wagers ever recorded in turf annals of the continent. Today he is rated among the wealthiest men in the state of California. On his return to the United States, Mr. Atkin proposes to bring back with him some blooded stock for his farm in California.
