## Around The World With Sport Fans

(By The Tramp)

Paul Heydrick, one man track team, from Potomac State School of Keyser, W. Va., set a record for individual scoring at the Penn State interscolastic track meet on Saturday with 33 points. The mountaineer boy took first places in the high jump, broad jump, pole vault, hammer throw, discus and javelin events. He also finished second in the shot-put. Heydrick's toss of 130 feet 2½ inches in the discus throw broke the old meet record by four inches. Fourteen schools figured in the final scoring.

Toronto is only one of several cities bidding for the services of Jack Delaney, Canadian light-heavyweight, whose sortie into the ranks of the heavies has convinced him that light-heavyweights are his dish. Delaney is now looking forward to a rest of some weeks at his camp in Maine, followed by a training campaign which will fit him for several battles. Dick Dunn, manager and matchmaker of the Detroit hockey rink, has offered the Canuck a bout with Jim Slattery of Buffalo. Philadelphia promoters would send Delaney against Tommy Loughran in the Sesquicentennial Stadium. This would afford the Quebec man an opportunity of regaining his light-heavyweight crown. The Toronto bout would put him in with Larry Gains. St. Louis offers a bout with "Chuck" Wiggin, and San Francisco sends in a bid.

Who will start the soft ball game in Prince Rupert? This seems to be the very place where it should be played. If it takes less space than baseball, it might not be difficult to locate grounds in different parts of the city, particularly near the Masonic Hall on Sixth Avenue where the city has four corners that could be used. If we are to be up to date all the sports should be played and this would appeal to those who possibly cannot join in many of the others.

Many local people are still looking forward to the coming Derby at Epsom when they hope their favorite horse will win. Among the entries Black Watch is said to be touched in the wind and is one of the doubtful quantities; Ranjit Singh is said to be a good stayer but he is not looked upon as exactly a "classic" colt. But is not by any means a sure thing that the favorites, Fairway and Bulsard, will win. Outsiders usually take quite a lot of the money.

A Reichswehr soldier named Hirschfeld put the shot at Breslau Monday during the training for the Olympics a distance of 51 feet 9 5-8 inches, making a new world's record. Whether this mark will stand inspection it is not known, since the conditions under which the record was made are not stated. However, Hirschfeld has shown extraordinary ability in recent tests, and on several occasions approached closely the record mark. He is looked upon as one of the surest bets in the German Olympic team, and is counted on to bring home first place at shotputting.

Charles Murray Buchan, who is retiring from active football, was born at Plumstead in 1891, and entered senior football while still a pupil at the Woolwich Polytechnic Secondary School. The tales of his prowess in those early days make his development into one of the finest forwards in modern football only a logical sequence. He assisted the Arsenal while still at school and, after playing in the Kent league, became a professional at the invitation of Leyton. In 1911, before he was 19, he signed on for Sunderland, with which club he remained for 14 seasons.

Before coming south again as captain of the Arsenal in 1925, he had scored over 200 goals, while the number he has inspired in other forwards is legion. To see this tall, angular figure dribble the ball down the field has become one of the chief delights of the game.

Buchan has played in four internationals, and last year led the Arsenal in the Cup Final, his first appearance in the final having been for Sunderland at the Crystal Palace in 1913. His ability as a strategist is equalled only by his powers as a team builder, and it is in him that Arsenal have found the lever to lift them out of the dangerous position in which they found themselves three years ago.
