### NATIONAL RACE TIGHTENING UP

CINCINNATI REDS LOSE TO GIANTS AND ST. LOUIS CARDINALS ARE BUT ONE GAME FROM TOP

(Special to Daily News)

NEW YORK, June 13.—The race for the supremacy of the National League was further tightened up as a result of yesterday's games. Cincinnati Red: lost to the New York Giants and the St. Louis Cardinals, who won over Boston, are now but one game behind the leaders with the Giants one-and-a-half games behind the Cards, Chicago Cubs in fourth place, lost to the Brooklyn Dodgers who are but five games from the top though still in fifth place. Pittsburgh Pirates drew their scattered forces together and beat the Phillies 15 to 4 in a loose game.

New York Yankees won their fourth game of the season in the American League by beating the Chicago White Sox, Philadelphia Athletics won 3 to 2 in a tight game over Detroit Tigers and the third place St. Louis Browns lost to Boston. Cleveland Indians continued their downward course by losing to the Washington Senators who displaced the Tigers from fifth place.
