EXPEDITION IS DUE TOMORROW

Stoll-McCracken Party Aboard Schooner Morrissey, is Approaching this Port.

The Stoll-McCracken Arctic Expedition party, which has been spending the summer engaged in historic research exploration work off the north coasts of America and Asia, is expected to reach Prince Rupert by tomorrow, although reports as to the exact time of arrival of the schooner Effie M. Morrissey, which has the expedition on board, were rather indefinite this morning. Local amateur radio station 5GT, which has maintained communication with the expedition during the entire time it has been in the north, was talking with the Morrissey at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon and the schooner was at that time 120 miles away and making rather slow progress in an unfavorable wind. The expectation is that the vessel will not arrive here before this evening at the earliest.

E. H. Stoll and Harold McCracken, co-leaders, and other members of the expedition will remain in the city for a few days before proceeding to New York and have accepted an invitation to address a joint dinner by the Women's Canadian Club and the Prince Rupert Board of Trade. The schooner Morrissey will proceed from here via the Panama Canal to her home port at St. John's Newfoundland.

EARLY PIONEER PASSES AWAY

William MacRae, Who Succumbed Saturday Night, had Resided in City Since 1907

Death at 9.45 Saturday night coming as the culmination of a two months' illness in the Prince Rupert General Hospital from which it had been realized for some time that he had no hope of recovery removed William MacRae of 230 Eighth Avenue West, one of Prince Rupert's real early pioneers and a generally esteemed and respected citizen. He had followed the shoemaking business here for over twenty years and was widely known.

Born in Sutherlandshire, Scotland, 68 years ago, the late Mr. MacRae came to Canada in 1905 and for a couple of years worked on the double-tracking of the Canadian Pacific Railway near Kenora, Ontario. He landed here in 1907 when Prince Rupert consisted merely of a few shacks and tents around old Rupert Road and was engaged from that time until his last illness in the shoemaking business. Deceased's family followed him here two years after his arrival.

Besides his widow, the late Mr. MacRae leaves to mourn his loss a family of five sons—John, Alister, Alex, Donald and Roderick. The two last mentioned have been called home to attend the funeral of their father which will be conducted by the B. C. Undertakers. The family will receive general sympathy in its bereavement.

The late Mr. MacRae was a member of the Loyal Orange Lodge and the Prince Rupert Pioneers' Association.

PRINCE RUPERT HAD MORE FOREST FIRES IN 1928 THAN 1927

Prince Rupert forestry district this year had 143 forest fires, this year as compared with 93 in 1927. The most fires of the year were in the southern interior district where there were 556 as compared with 576 last year. The Kamloops district had the least fires this year, 98 as against 70 in 1927. Prince George district had 162 fires as compared with last year's 120.
