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ADJOURNMENT ALLOWED FALSIFICATION CASE

William Beyon Given Until This Morning to Consult With His Counsel

At the request of John V. Clyne, counsel for the accused, Magistrate McClymont in city police court yesterday afternoon allowed the adjournment until this morning in the case of William Beyon, who is charged with falsifying the books of the Northern B.C. Salmon Fishermen's Association of which he was formerly secretary.

Mr. Clyne stated that he had only been retained as counsel for ten minutes and he felt that he was entitled to some time to consult with his client against whom a serious charge had been laid. He wished to make himself familiar with the constitution of the Association.

"The constitution of the Association has nothing to do with this case," replied L. W. Patmore, counsel for the Association. "This man is simply charged with falsifying an account which he signed himself." Mr. Patmore stated that witnesses in the case were fishermen who would be losing time if an adjournment were given.

After further argument, Magistrate McClymont adjourned the case until today with Mr. Patmore consenting.

Accused was released under \$500 bond on his own recognizance.

ESTABLISHMENT OF HOSPITAL LAUNDRY

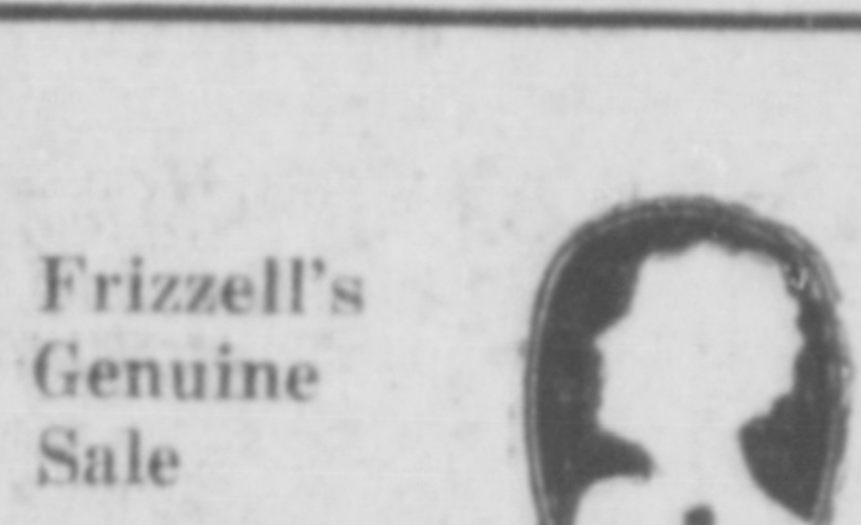
