MUSKRAT FARM AT MASSETT

ESTIMATED POPULATION NOW EIGHT THOUSAND AND THEY ARE INCREASING RAPIDLY

FEEDING CRESS AND RICE

MARKETING WILL COMMENCE NEXT YEAR WHEN NUMBER OF PELTS WILL BE SOLD

From a start of twenty pair two years ago, the population of A. D. Hallett's muskrat farm near Massett has now increased to an estimated eight thousand, reports Mr. Hallett who has been in the city for the past few days. The little fur bearers have multiplied by leaps and bounds under conditions which seem to be altogether favorable, each pair maintaining at least an average increase of thirty-six and the new animals breeding a few months after birth.

To supplement the natural feed on the ground, Mr. Hallett has planted his half section of land extensively in water cress and wild rice. The fur farm is about three miles from Massett on the Delkatis side and the muskrats run at large in a sort of natural amphitheatre, few if any having ever strayed away.

Next March Mr. Hallett expects to start pelting a large number. Then he will begin to realize on an investment which he states has now stood him something over \$11,000.

WATER NOTICE CLEARING STREAMS

The estimated mileage between the said points is 4 1/2 miles, more or less. The term of the license is 21 years. This notice was posted on the ground on the 20th day of June, 1928. A copy of this notice and an application pursuant thereto and to the "Water Act" will be filed in the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert, B.C. The petition for approval of undertaking and an application for approval of the Schedule of Tolls will be heard in the office of the Board of Investigation at a date to be fixed, and any interested person may file an objection thereto in the office of the Comptroller or of the Water Recorder of the District. Objections to the application may be filed with the said Water Recorder or with the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C., within thirty days after the first appearance of this notice in a local newspaper. NEW BUILDING NEAR FINISHED

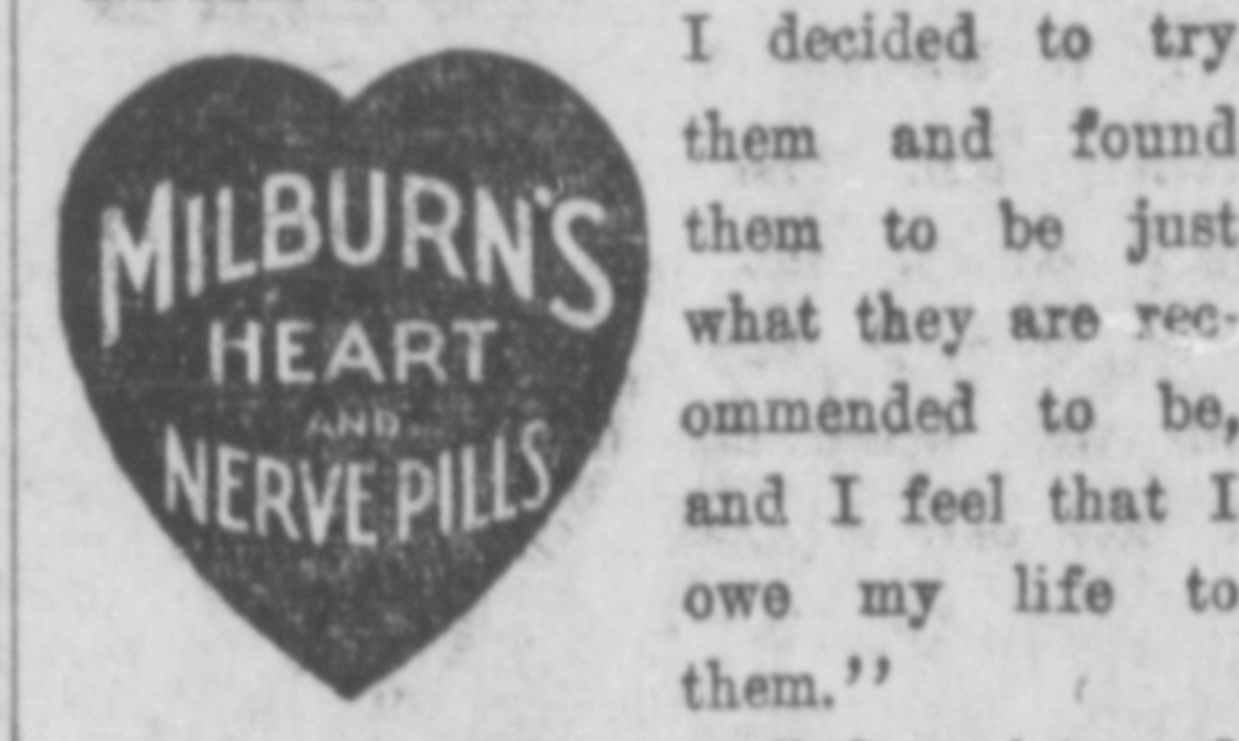
ROSS BROS. STRUCTURE ON SECOND AVENUE CREDIT TO CITY AND TESTIMONY TO BUILDERS' PROGRESSIVENESS

Fencing was removed yesterday from around the new building of Ross Bros. on Second Avenue just west of Sixth Street, revealing another structure, of concrete construction throughout and fireproof, which will be a credit to the architecture of the city as well as a testimony to the progressiveness of its citizens. Good progress has been made in construction by the contractors, Mitchell & Currie, and the building is to be ready for occupancy about August 1. Exterior work is practically completed, attention now being devoted to the interior.

Measuring 100 by 25 feet, the full size of the lot the building is one storey in height with fifty foot basement. The main floor, containing billiard hall, cigar store and taxi stand, has a fourteen-foot ceiling and the basement ceiling is nine feet. The billiard hall will contain eight tables, two large and six small.
