Sockeye Season Opening Next Week-Naas River and "23" Figure in Deal-Boats Chartered for Fish Packing

All the preliminaries to the opening of another salmon canning season at midnight next Tuesday when sockeye fishing becomes permissible are now practically complete at the many cannery plants in this extensive district. With optimism expressed as to the probability of a generally better run of fish than prevailed last year, it is expected that fishing during the forthcoming season will be as intensive as the considerably amended regulations will permit in both gill net and seining areas for all varieties of fish. 
