

### LIQUOR STORE CLOSÉS AT ALICE ARM BY ORDER CONTROL BOARD

Stock Transferred to Anyox and Manager Goes to Burns Lake

ALICE ARM Dec. 14:—Orders have been received from the Liquor Control Board to close down the Vendor's store here. The

stock on hand will be transferred to the Anyox store. It is understood the slight turn over in stock during the slack period of the winter months does not justify the expense of its upkeep. It will be recalled that it was discontinued for a short period last winter, and opened up again with the return of the activity of the mining season.

Charles Hutchison, who has been in charge as vendor since the store was opened in 1923, has

been transferred to Burns Lake, leaving Monday to take up his new duties.

### CANADA LEADS IN DEVELOPING ELECTRIC POWER

H. E. Pawson Tells Rotary Club of Value to Countries and Communities of Cheap Power

Canada leads the world in the production of electrical power according to population, with Norway second, Switzerland third, and United States fourth, according to H. E. Pawson, representative of the Canada Power Company, in addressing the Rotary Club yesterday. Also, the speaker said that the production of electrical energy came fifth among the industries of the continent, agriculture being first, railways second, contracting third, oil fourth and electrical power fifth. All were interested in electrical development because on it depended the conditions under which the people lived.

Mr. Pawson said the condition of labor varied in the countries in the ratio of the development of electrical energy. The supplanting of hand labor by machinery was the first step in the development of the status of labor but it was not until 1919 that the full force of the electrical development was felt. Canada developed fourteen million horse-power and this had nearly all taken place in connection with public utilities. Mr. Pawson pointed to the almost total absence of slums in this country and Norway was somewhat similar to Canada, with Switzerland coming next, Ger-

many next, and England being away down in this regard. In Egypt, Greece and Rome the arts thrived when they had cheap labor and today the countries with cheap electrical motive power were the countries that succeeded. Every working man in Canada had ten horse-power at his elbow, while in the United States he had only four horsepower. Canada has the most comfortably situated working men in the world today.

The speaker then went on to tell of an instance in the east where they had a municipally owned plant. The town was struggling and was unable to bear the cost of extending its plant. A public utility company took hold of the situation and today the place was thriving with 10,000 population and the prospect of 15,000 within a year. This could not have been done without the development of electric power.

Mr. Pawson gave a number of further facts and figures in connection with the value of electrical development, all tending to show its use affected the life of communities and countries.

Mr. Pawson was thanked for his address by H. B. Rochester, who presided.
