The Congress is therefore essentially a lobby for the promotion of legislation on behalf of the members of branch unions of United States labor organizations operating in Canada. It is not allowed to accept affiliation or make representations on behalf of any organized body of Canadian workers except those affiliated with or not dual to A.F. of L. organizations in Canada. Following the adoption of a resolution at the 1902 convention of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, by which the Congress excluded from affiliation all national unions which were dual to international organizations, various national and independent unions thus excluded from the Congress established the Canadian Federation of Labor. Subsequently, other Canadian unions were organize, and these, with the Canadian Feder-
