CANADA CLOSER TO BRITAIN IS PREMIER'S WORD

MACKENZIE KING ARRIVES IN FRANCE AND RECEIVES MEDAL FOR PEACE WORK

PARIS, Aug. 24.—Browned and benefited by the transatlantic crossing, Premier Mackenzie King descended the gangplank of the Ile de France alongside of Secretary Frank Kellogg today at La Havre. Leon Meyer, mayor of Havre, greeted them and presented a medal to Mr. King saying: "We shall never forget that you were and have remained one of the first men who toiled in the cause of peace." Mr. Kellogg received a gold pen.

Premier King and Secretary Kellogg later arrived in Paris. Interviewed here the Premier indicated that after attending the session of the League of Nations next month he intends to go to England, then return to Paris at the end of September for the inauguration of the Canadian legation.

The Premier said the Government proposed to establish legations in other countries than France but that decision did not indicate any separatist

SIR HENRY COMMENDS ACTION OF CAPTAIN MANNING IN MAKING PRESENTATION

MONTREAL, Aug. 24.—"An act worthy of the best traditions of the British mercantile marine and in accordance with the spirit that governs all men of the Canadian National service in the face of emergencies," was the comment of Sir Henry Thornton in presenting Captain W. C. Manning of the steamer Canadian Pathfinder with a gold watch. The gift was from the Canadian Government in recognition of his service and those of the crew in rescuing the crew of the schooner Mayotte of Lunenburg after the vessel had been battered by a storm.

FLAT FISH IN HECATE STRAIT

TRAWLER G. E. FOSTER BRINGS 10,000 POUNDS TO COLD STORAGE

Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co.'s steam trawler G. E. Foster, which has been put into commission by the company for the purpose of taking flat fish in Hecate Straits, returned to port on August 23, after three days' fishing, with her first catch consisting of some 40,000 pounds. It is planned that the vessel shall make several more trips for the same sort of fish, the desirability of which as a food is gradually becoming realized. Captain Sanderson is in command of the Foster.
