COLUMBUS, Ohio, Jan. 19.—Bachelors have little chance of getting into "Who's Who," according to Dr. Albert E. Wiggam, scientist and author who attended the American Psychological Association meeting here.

"Married men are the ones who rise to fame and fortune," he said. "The likelihood of such an achievement rises with the number of children increasingly until there are four in the family."

These conclusions have been arrived at through statistics, he indicated. More and more data is being gathered by eugenicists to corroborate these findings, he said.

Speaker at Glasgow Bank Meeting Says It is "Beggaring" Homes

GLASGOW, Jan. 20.—Glasgow Savings Bank reports an increase of considerably over half a million sterling in its funds, which has now a balance of nearly £22,000,000 due to depositors. The Rev. John White, at the annual meeting, declared that high taxation and excessive local rates were not only reducing the capacity, but weakening the desire to save. A wise scheme of rationing public expenditure would give a general impetus to thrift. The nation could not afford greyhound racing, which was beggaring homes and impoverishing character.

# MILLION EXAMINED AT ELLIS ISLAND

NEW YORK, Jan. 19.—Ellis Island handled more than 120,000 of the 164,667 aliens admitted to this country in 1927, Immigration Commissioner Day reported. The remainder of the admissions were handled at Boston, San Francisco, Seattle and by inspectors at the Canadian and Mexican borders. Ellis Island records showed that 1,100,000 persons were examined, 5,000 vessels boarded, 600 stowaways excluded and 4,000 aliens deported.
