CINEMA CITY VICTORIA SOON

April 1 Set as Probable Date of
Beginning Construction Work
for Movie Industry

VICTORIA, Jan. 30.—The actual construction of Cinema City, a fully-equipped motion picture colony to be established in the Highland district, will be in progress by April 1, 1926. James J. Wright, of Hollywood, California, told the newspaper here upon his arrival in Victoria from Southern California, where he has been sojourning for the past three months.

Mr. Wright declared that Cinema City, Limited, the holding company, would be incorporated here before the end of the present week. This company will conduct the sale of lands in Cinema City, and carry on all the preparatory work, including the erection of the first unit, the studio, prior to the incorporation of the Canadian National Pictures Producing and Marketing Company, which will be incorporated under a Dominion charter at \$10,000,000, of which between \$4,000,000 and \$5,000,000 of seven per cent preferred stock will be sold in Canada.

Mr. Wright stated that the manager of the Canadian National Pictures Producing and Marketing Company would be Clarke Thomas, of Hollywood, California, who built the Thomas H. Ince studios, and who is general manager of Thomas H. Incorporated, having charge of all building, production and marketing of that concern.

ALBERTA MINES PRODUCE WELL

More Fuel Than Ever Before Dug Last Year Says Official Report

EDMONTON, Jan. 30.—Coal production in Alberta last year was the largest ever, reaching a total for all grades of 6,936,755 tons. Figures compiled by the mines branch show that 1927 went 2,832 tons ahead of the best previous year, 1920, thus establishing a new record in the history of the Alberta coal industry.

The year's yield is considered highly satisfactory by the government, according to Premier Brownlee, and shows that the mining business of the province is on the upward grade again. It is hoped that the present year will better even this grand total, and a goal of 7,000,000 tons plus is to be aimed at.
