The features of the new car are: pleasing appearance, great power, high Leca. Mexibility, roadability, unusual getaway, economical operation and rugtd. simplified construction. Design and construction hitherto peculiar to high-priced machines are incorporated in the new product.

The wheelbase is 1031/2 inthes, and the lower suspension and 'caply-crowned, gracefully contoured re-piece fenders are pleasing to the ye and suggest speed and stability. odies are of all-steel construction and a new type of one-piece, steel spoke wheel employing a drop-centre tire and climinating the old-fashioned rim and paid in advance for yearly period \$2.00 rim clamps is employed.
