FORECAST OF P.G.E. POLICY

It is understood that the proposed bill for the completion of the Pacific Great Eastern Railway will give the government powers to borrow and spend \$4,000,000 for that purpose. But he powers may never be exercised, for the very fact that the government holds them will aid in bringing about the successful termination of the present negotiations for the sale of the road.

When the late Premier Oliver took the matter up with the heads of the 20 great Canadian railways several years ago, he was told, without ceremony, that he had nothing to offer but a railway that began nowhere and ended nowhere, and, moreover, that for a very long time to come the same condition would prevail, since the people of British Columbia would not put any more money into the undertaking. Neither company professed the slightest interest in the line. "It is naught, it is naught," said the prospective buyer, and he said it with the greatest conviction, because he believed that he could obtain what was offered at his own price at any time he found it convenient.

EDWARD GRIEG IS MEETING SUBJECT

Life and Works of Famous Norwegian Musician Studied at Ladies' Music Club Yesterday

The Ladies' Music Club held a post-noon meeting yesterday afternoon at the home of Mrs. E. W. Marenstette, 15 Custom Street. The subject of study was the life and works of Edward Hagerup Grieg, celebrated Norwegian pianist and composer. A paper in the subject by Mrs. Marenstette revealed how Grieg, who was born in 1843 and died in 1907, presented the characteristics of his country's music with strong accentuation in numerous compositions of great melodic beauty, the greatest and best known of his works having been the opera "Peer Gynt."
