## FISHERMEN IN CONVENTION AT PRINCE RUPERT

Met This Morning Under Chairmanship of Ambrose Reid and Heard Committee Reports

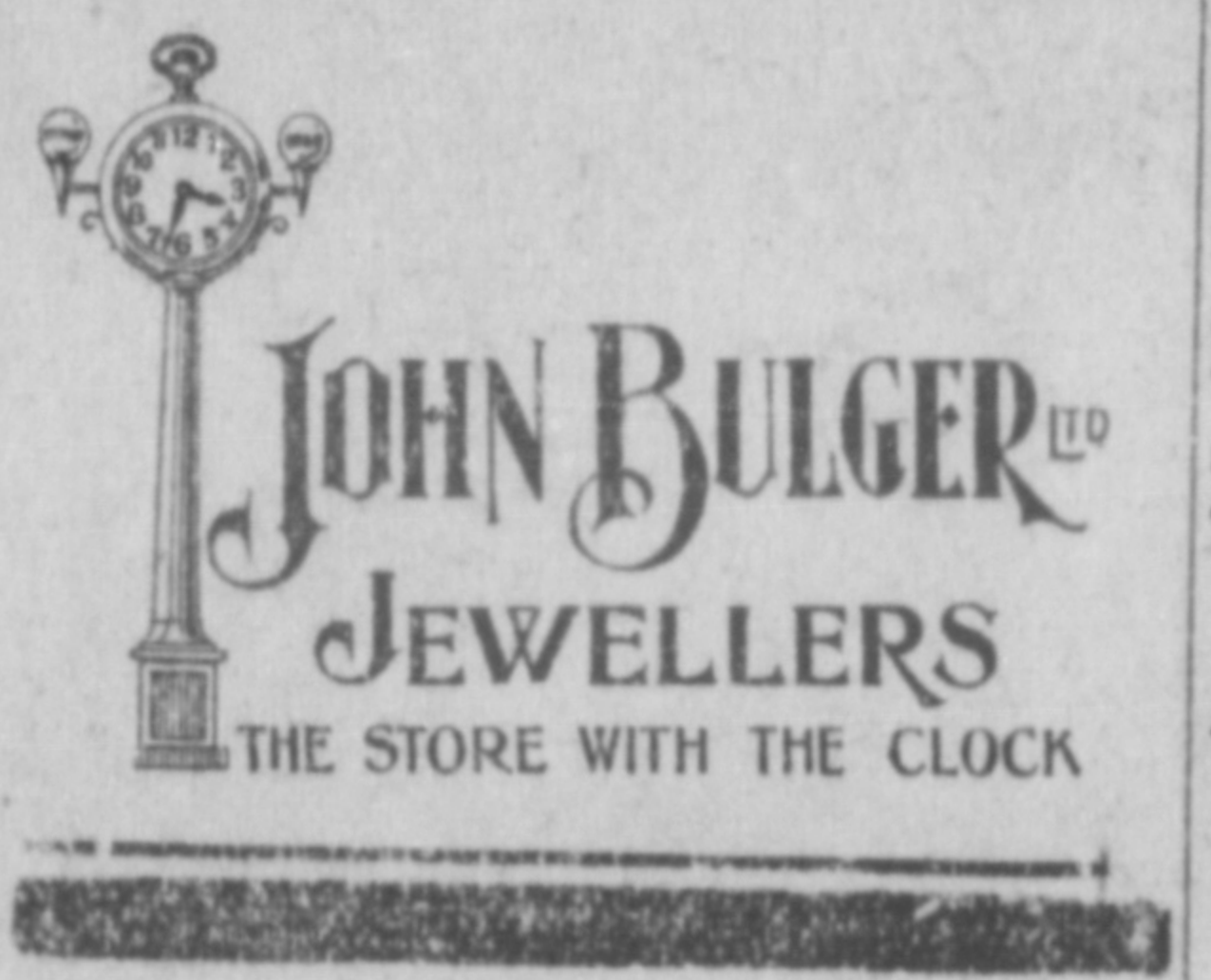
A crowd of some forty or fifty representative salmon fishermen was gathered together this morning for the opening of the convention of the Northern British Columbia Salmon Fishermen's Association at which proposals made for changes in the fisheries regulations for the purpose of conservation of the fish on this coast will be discussed. Presiding over the convention is Ambrose Reid of this city, who was chairman of the organization committee leading up to the holding of the convention, while William Beynon is acting as secretary. The convention opened in the city council chamber soon after ten o'clock. Various reports of the organization committee and its members were presented this morning and the convention is engaging in a full and free discussion of the salmon fishery situation as it exists today. Resolutions for submission to the fishery department at Ottawa, it is expected, will be propounded.

In opening the convention, Mr. Reid reported briefly upon the activities of the organization committee since it had been formed in the fall. Several meetings had been held and the committee had been active in bringing together the fishermen for the organization. A number of reports had been prepared which would be read in due course. All the members of the committee had worked diligently among the various classes of fishermen, including the natives.

Certain things had cropped up for the committee to deal with. One of the most important of these matters had been in connection with the recent visits to the city of W. A. Found, director of fisheries for the federal government. While he had the proposals of the cannermen, evidence of the fishermen, however, had not been taken by Mr. Found who had not committed himself on certain proposals that had been set forward by the latter. Mr. Found had been informed that the fishermen would discuss the situation at a later date and that their views would be forwarded to him. This was one of the purposes in calling the present convention. The committee had drawn up a program for the convention in the hands of which the matter now rested to act as it saw fit.

On behalf of the white fishermen, Mike Anderson, another member of the organization committee, stated that he had nothing to add to the remarks that had been made by Mr. Reid.  
William Beynon, another member of the committee, referred to the unanimous endorsement of the new Association had received among the natives of Port Simpson.  
The report of the committee was then adopted on motion of Matt Olsen, seconded by A. Ramsay, and the organization of the convention proceeded. Ambrose Reid was elected chairman on motion of A. O. Morse and W. Beynon secretary on motion of Mike Anderson.  
Among those present this morning was Fred Stork, ex-M.P.

**LIBERAL WOMEN PLAN MEETING**  
Banquet to be Held at Ottawa and National Organization Formed  
Liberal women from all parts of Canada will gather in Ottawa on April 17 and 18 to launch permanently their Dominion organization. All the provinces will be represented. Meetings are to be held in the Chateau Laurier, and there is to be a great political banquet at which the Prime Minister, Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, will be the guest of honor and principal speaker. As the convention takes place while Parliament is sitting, it is expected to attract an unusually large representation of Liberal women. Also a fine program of social entertainment is being planned.

Leading Liberal women at Ottawa and the wives of cabinet ministers are making arrangements for the national convention. The main business of the meetings will, of course, be the efficient formation of a national body, strongly constituted and officered. Prominent Liberal women from the various provinces will give addresses.

There is no intention on the part of Liberal women to form a women's party, national leaders state. Rather, the April meetings are for the purpose of consolidating all organizations of Liberal women, and of forming further organizations in all districts of the Dominion. Through such organizations they hope to inculcate the principles of Liberalism, blending the practical application of principles with the ideal.
