

DOLLAR CASE

Judgment Given in Tests Regard Liability for Bonds Given by

OTTAWA, Oct. 27.-Judgments have been delivered by Mr. Justice McLean, president of the exchequer court, in favor of the Dominion of Canada in an action brought against the Fidelity Insurance Co, of Canada on a bond of \$3,707 and against the Vancouver Breweries Ltd. on three bonds amounting to \$5,727.

The actions are regarded as test cases in connection with suits for approximately \$4,000,000 ordered by the minister of national revenue following representations of the Royal Customs Commission in regard to bonds given by liquor exporters of Vancouver in regard to shipments in bond to Mexico, Central and South American ports.
