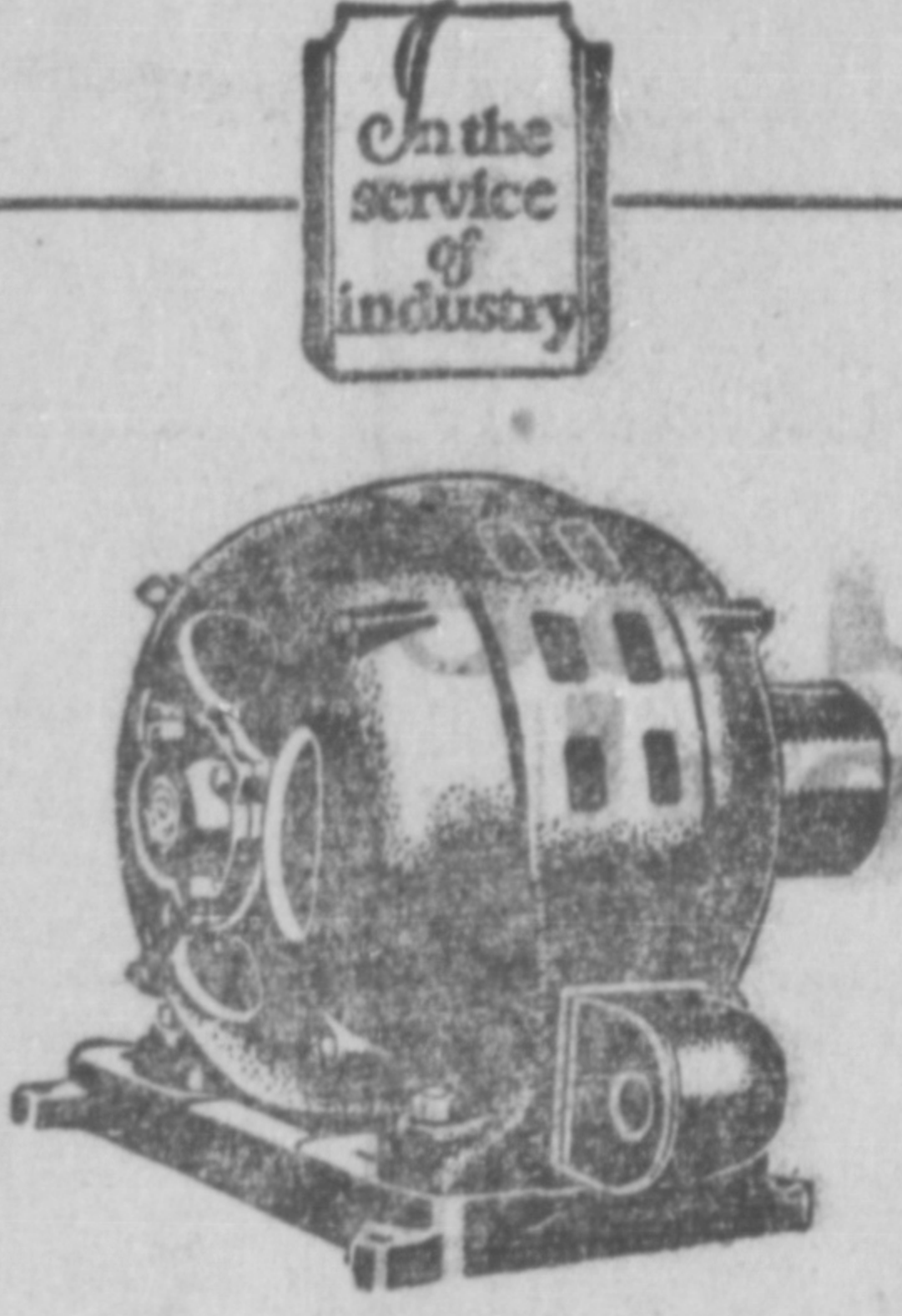

POINCARÉ IS SPECTACULAR AS A LEADER

FRENCH PREMIER, WHO HAS BEEN GIVEN ANOTHER LEASE OF POWER, NOT A MUSSOLINI

WORKS AT HIGH TENSION Knowledge of Almost Everything Discouraging to Experts Who Advise Him

From the result of the elections in France it would seem as if Premier Poincaré was to continue as leader of the Government for a further period, but those who know how changeable are the French deputies will realize how uncertain is his future.

Poincaré is an extremely clever man, with outstanding ability in certain directions. He reads three times as fast as the average professional man. He writes at such a speed, without crossings-out or interpolations, that he has no need of a shorthand typist and does not employ one. The common faculty of remembering readily what one writes he possesses in an extreme degree. All his speeches are written out and simultaneously committed to memory. His literal accuracy is impeccable. On the second day of his conference with Bonar Law in January, 1923, the conference which preceded the French entry into the Ruhr, M. Poincaré received his experts at 2.30 p.m. They need spend an hour or two the night before in collecting material which will

enable him to say something that seems fresh and informed even to an audience of specialists. GETS HIS OWN WAY It is the secret both of his successes and of his failures that M. Poincaré is the prisoner of his own mental processes. He gets his way with colleagues—especially when he is at the head of a one-man government, as he was from 1922 to 1924—by the sheer force of a mind made up. Public opinion, when a national issue is involved, is dragged in his wake owing to the same impression of imposing certainty. That aim at unalterable certainty, at absolute intellectual consistency, is, nevertheless, M. Poincaré's crippling fault. Once he has studied his subject, the conception at which he has arrived must be kept intact or he is done. Once he has constructed a paragraph which exactly expresses his views on the French debt to America or on the stabilization of the exchange, he repeats it slavishly in speech after speech. Nothing is more characteristic of this mental rigidity than his inability to ignore criticism. The minutest comment from the most negligible of adversaries draws him into speech when silence would be the best reply. His policy must stand entire. He maps out affairs in a strict order, making in advance the stages in the accomplishment of his plan. A check shakes but does not divert him. No margin is left for give and take. It is the supreme misfortune of M. Poincaré that the world, incomprehensibly, never quite sees what he expects or wants. If the earth were a mechanical toy he would be a great ruler.

RECENT DEVICE FOR HARPOON

WHALE HUNTERS ADOPT NORWEGIAN METHODS AND HOPE BETTER SUCCESS

VANCOUVER, May 1.—A new Norwegian device which is expected to increase the range and effectiveness of harpoon guns in quest of the wily North Pacific whale will be tested this season by whalers out of British Columbia ports. The whaling fleet is now being prepared for active operations off the west coast of Vancouver Island.

The Norwegian invention, called a foregor, is a specially treated line spliced to the harpoon. In the past British Columbia whalers have been using a four and one half inch Manila rope. Ordinarily this swells and grows heavier when it gets wet. If a rope is treated with the foregor process, a three and three quarter inch line may be used with no danger of increased weight because of the water absorption.

The Norwegian whalers have met with good success with the foregor, and it is expected that its use on the Pacific will enable vessels to harpoon their quarry at a considerably greater distance. The present range of harpoon guns is about 120 feet and this is expected to be much extended.

Last year 220 whales were caught off the coast during the season and with better weather conditions prevailing it is hoped to greatly increase that number this year.
