SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

PRE-EMPTIONS. Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 25 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects.

PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes.

HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year.

LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.
