MURDER TRIAL OPENED WITH EFFORT TO SHOW ACCUSED WAS INSANE

(continued from page one)

After the jury had been empannelled, other petit jurors were excused from further attendance until tomorrows. The Grand Jury, having returned true bills in the two murder cases before the Assize, was discharged from further service, the judge congratulating it upon the despatch with which it had carried out its work.

The case for the crown was briefly outlined by the crown prosecutor who explained his duties to the petit jury. Accused, his father, mother, brother and sister all lived at Delkatla and on January 18, accused and his father left for their two pre-emptions about four or five miles distant. Nothing was heard from the father who was expected back about January 27. Finally a search party had been sent out, the cuimination being the finding of the body partly shattered in a shallow grave. Accused was subsequently arrested and charged with the murder of his father.

DOCTOR'S EVIDENCE Dr. J. C. S. Dunn told of proceeding on Sunday, January 29, to a point where the search party, under the leadership of the accused, had unearthed the body of the late James Smith. The doctor described the nature of the ground and told how accused had pointed to the spot. Witness performed a post-mortem and described the condition of the body. Part of the body was missing as a result of the explosion of powder. Death. the doctor concluded, had been originally due to hemmorhage for which the cause had not been found. After Dr. Dunn had been heard, he was ex. cused from further appearance in order that he might return to Massett where he had an urgent call.

Constable Grant testified that accused had come to him on January 28 and reported that his father was missing. Search parties went out with no success. Accused had accompanied the first search parties. Asked as to the firearms on the pre-emptions, he (accused) had explained that there was a shotgun and rifle, the rifle being missing. Accused had not accompanied a large search party which went out the next day. That night Frank Smith, brother of accused, came to the officer's
