U.S. TROLLERS IN B.C. WATERS

LETTER IN REGARD TO MATTER RECEIVED FROM DEPUTY MINISTER AT OTTAWA

Last evening at the meeting of the board of trade a letter was received from W. A. Pound, deputy minister of fisheries, in connection with foreign boats fishing in Canadian waters as follows:

"I wish to acknowledge with thanks your letter of the 20th instant, further with regard to reported fishing by United States salmon trollers in Canadian waters.


"Your criticism of the 'Malaspina' is noted, and there is no question that from certain standpoints it has force, but the department's experience is that those concerned soon come to know any boat that is used for protective purposes, and that all things considered speed is an outstandingly important factor in patrol boats dealing with foreign fishing vessels. When dealing with Canadian boats speed is not such a dominant factor, as such boats are liable to seizure at any time after having been known to violate the law.

"If the department could have the co-operation of the Canadian halibut boats, as well as other Canadian fishing boats, there is no room for doubt that the situation could be most efficiently and satisfactorily handled. If such boats, when they found a United States boat in Canadian waters in violation of the law, would make a careful observation of where the boat was at the time and what it was doing, and would furnish the information to this department, it would make it practicable to seize such boat whenever it would be again found in Canadian waters, and to take the necessary court proceedings looking to its condemnation.

"The department feels that you will not misunderstand the above. It is its earnest desire to prevent all such illegal fishing, and is not seeking to sidetrack any of its responsibilities, but your board will realize that in its efforts to prevent infractions of the law reasonable economy must be exercised. Your board may rest assured that this department is following the situation from all standpoints as closely as it can with the facilities at its disposal, and these are being increased continuously to meet growing requirements.

SID CHAPLIN MISSING LINK

One of Funniest Pictures Says Expert Regard to Week-end Film

Moving picture directors are not usually moved to laughter by the performances they call into being, but in several of the sequences of the jungle jamboree known as "The Missing Link," Charles F. Reisner, as well as the rest of the company, burst into uncontrollable mirth.

"I have been making comedies, or acting in them, for sixteen years," said Reisner, "and I insist that this is the funniest film ever shot." Syd Chaplin, creator of Old Bill in "The Better 'Ole," is unbelievably droll as the hungry and timorous London poet, who suddenly finds himself transformed into a lion hunter on the way to African jungles.

Glenn Tryon, who with Patsy Ruth Miller is starred in the picture, is a correspondence school aviator who builds his own plane in order to enter a race across the Atlantic. FOREIGN BORN MAKE GOOD SCHOOL RECORDS

On one subject he made 100, and even on English Literature, in which a foreign-born student is naturally at a disadvantage he was marked 84. The achievement of this Calgary boy goes along well with that of a Russian girl in Toronto, who at 15 did not know any English and at 19 was declared a brilliant student at Toronto University.
