

STAVINAIR

to Record Endurance Flight

LONDON, Nov. 13.-The assembly stage is now being reached in a most interesting attempt to evolve British Aircraft capable of remaining in the air for three days and three nights continuouusly.

This machine, a Fairey-Napier monoplane, which has been built by the Fairey Aviation Company, Hayes, to the order of Air Ministry, is being fitted with the latst Napier Lion engine and represents a departure from general British practice in that a monoplane form instead of a biplane has been chosen. The present endurance record, held by Germany, was set up in July when Herren Tisticz and Zimmerman in Junkers monoplane remained in the air for 651/2 hours, thus beating the Italian record of 58 hours 42 minutes made in June, and the fact that nation after nation strives to raise the record has led to British experiments being hailed as a challenge to the foreign endurance records. This. is correct in one sense, but it is understood that the main purpose of the Air Ministry is to further research upon long endurance, which have a great practical value in view of the scattered stragetic bases of the Empire.

Exhaustive consumption and performance tests must be made before any real attempt can be started to fly continuously for the longest time possible, and the attainment of any new record paragoo by Great Britain depends in the end upon a decimal point in the fuel consumption of the engine, assuming complete efficiency everywhere else.


